







The Forestry Course in a Lumbering Region.

By Robert Barclay Miller, M F Professor of Forestry in the University

of New Brunswick.

Prof Miller, who is the head of the Forestry Department of the University of New Brunswick, spoke first of the recent conference of forestry educators in Washington, called together by Mr Gifford Pinceot, when, although all kinds of forest schools were represented from the ranger schools of the west to the big post graduate institutions, there was a anapimity of view as to certain main ines of forestry instruction. British Politics.

In the newly-elected House of Commons in Great Britain the Liberal Government had a majority of 31 on the first division. The Nationalists refrained from voting and the Labor Party supported the Govern ment. This is scarcely a working majority and leaves the government at the mercy of the Home Rulers. Just at present no one is very anxious for the overthrow of Mr Asquith's administration until supplies have been voted, but another general election within a year seems almost inevitable.
