Forsyth, Ga., June 6th, 1910.
Dear Sentinel.—We are in a rainy spell, the first for ten days. Crops began to feel the need of it. Wheat and oats are being harvested. Cotton is up and being chopped or thinned out. Garden corn is being run through the humane mill, much to the satisfaction of the consumer. Irish potatoes are going the same road; also beets and all garden truck, so you see we are living high and sleeping in the garret, providing you cut out the meat question, for when that is in the bill of fare we are let down three pegs, and our purse looks as if an elephant had set his big foot on it, but we must submit to the cruel hand of the designing trusts and speculators.

We frequently resort to our poultry yards and find relief. Our hens are true to us only when they go on a strike then the current turns the other way, food going out and no food coming in except when the good wife decides to wring off a head occasionally, then home matters run smooth until there is a call for twenty-cent steak or seventeen-cent roast. This gives another turn to the oppressive screw on the poor man's purse, but for most of this trouble the farmers are to blame, for there is scarcely an article of food that they cannot raise successfully in Georgia if they try. It may be that during the next two generations they may learn this important lesson: Produce what they need at home. Our fruit crop promises much. Two trains passed yesterday with about thirty cars each loaded with fruit. God ripens the fruit Sunday as other days, and our lawmakers permit its transportation on the Lords day, and all saints and sinners alike eat and enjoy it on Sunday, and often to excess as this scribe can attest from last night's experience, too many delicious strawberries for supper. A CANADIAN PRODUCT.

Wins Out in Australia.

Montreal—On May 22nd the S S "Rakai" sailed from this port for Auckland, New Zealand, this being the first sailing of the recently subsidized C P R line from Montreal to Australia and New Zealand.

Part of the "Rakai's" cargo consisted of two carloads of "2 in 1" Shoe Polish, made in Hamilton by F F Dalley Co. This is the third shipment of "2 in 1" sent to Australia by the Dalley people within the last year. The first, sent June 8th last, consisted of 1,000 gross, the second, sent Nov 2nd contained 1,500 gross, or 221,750 boxes. This brings the total of "2 in 1" sent to Australia within the year up to 581,750 boxes. Last winter, the elevator of the Government railway handled 1,625,830 bushels, an increase of nearly half a million bushels over the figures of the previous year.

PUMPING WATER.

How It Is Done in the City of Montreal.

There are two methods known at present for disinfecting. One is by the use of chemicals and the other is by oxidation. The use of chemicals requires an expert, for the chemicals are fully as dangerous as the impure water and if the person who is doing the disinfecting is not well acquainted with his work he is apt to kill the users of the water as he is to kill the bacteria.

Oxidation is merely another form of burning. The action is the same as when any object is burnt by fire. New carbon is the most combustible and easily burned substance in existence. Bacteria are composed of 88 per cent, water, which needs nothing done to it, and 14 per cent combustible matter, and of this 6 per cent is carbon. Therefore it is easy to see that if the proper oxidizing agent is introduced the bacteria will be annihilated. It has been the dream of scientists for many years to discover the oxidizing agent needed.

The value of oxidizing for purification has been known for about 7,000 years. In ancient Egypt the people placed their knives in the fire before operating upon a patient. This was merely a way of sterilizing by oxidation. They knew not why they did it, but they did know the effect that it had upon the patient.

The means of applying ozone as an oxidizing agent is very simple. An intimate mixture with the water is all that is needed. For this purpose sterilizing wells are needed. Rough filters are used first in order that large pieces of organic matter may be removed, such as dead fish, leaves etc. These filters are not intended to purify the water, but simply to cleanse it in a rough way. The bacteria are still left in it.

The ozone is brought into contact with the water by means of aspirators. About three times as much gas is used as water. There are two grams of ozone for every cubic centimeter of water. This proportion will oxidize every bit of poison which comes from a former presence of bacteria.

That there is great danger from this poison is shown by the following illustration. Water containing a bit of poison emanating from a lockjaw bacillus which would amount to 1 50,000,000 of a gram would kill a mouse in one second. When purified by ozone, water containing this poison would not harm the mouse.

Another feature of water purification which is very important is that the purifying apparatus must always work. There should be no variation in its thoroughness. Any stream or source of supply is subject to a greater possibility of infection at certain times and the purifier must always be working at its highest degree of efficiency.

Another feature in favor of the ozone system is the simplicity with the plant is operated. All that is needed is to turn a switch the same as you would turn on an electric light. The plant must be constructed by an expert but an expert is not required to run it. In Europe the plants are clumsy and need skilled attention but the American improvements have made the plants here very simple of operation.

The cost in the United States is surely very nominal. At Ann Arbor we are purifying water at a cost of 51 cents a million gallons. In the city of Baltimore electricity costs a little more and we purify the water there at the rate of 60 cents a million gallons.

Mr Leggett asserted that many large cities of France and Germany have adopted the ozone method of water purification. This included Paris. Such action was not taken until the plan had thoroughly tested and had been found not only to be the best method of purifying water but in fact the only satisfactory method. It had been slow of adoption in this country on account of its cost, but this cost has been materially reduced by the American process as I have already noted.

Ozone itself is rearrangement of oxygen. The oxygen molecule has two atoms in it while the ozone molecule has three atoms. I will not go into details concerning the chemical process. It is sufficient to say that ozone is the most powerful oxidizing agency in the world.
