### SAYS FARMERS MAKE A MISTAKE.

Senator Baird Says He Believes They Are Raising Too Many Potatoes.

**HIS REASONS:**—Declares Exploiting of the Cuban Trade in Potatoes to be a Very Unwise Policy for the Province—The Valley Railroad.

Senator Baird, of Andover, was in the city yesterday prior to leaving for Montreal. Speaking to The Telegraph regarding the agricultural situation in the river section at the north of the province, Senator Baird condemned as bad business the manner in which the farmers were placing their reliance in the Cuban potato trade. "We are too near Aroostook up there," he said. "The people have been unhappily attached by the methods of the farmers on the other side of the line. The success of the Aroostook farmers in devoting their energies so largely to the cultivation of potatoes has excited our own farmers to such an extent that they have almost entirely forsaken their old staple means of livelihood. They have now almost only one thing to depend upon—potatoes. In seasons such as the past one has been, when potatoes are largely a drug upon the market, they find themselves in difficulties. "Oats are bringing a high price in St. John and elsewhere at present, but these are none in Carleton and the neighboring counties to be shipped. Formerly we shipped thousands of bushels of grain annually to St. John alone and made a good profit at it. We have now little but potatoes, and they are of no very great value. "The exploiting of the Cuban trade in potatoes seems to me to be a very unwise policy for the province. Not only has it led the farmers to rush into potato raising to the exclusion of other profitable crops, but it does not seem either that the trade which can be worked up in Cuba is proportionate to the excitement which has been aroused over it. The island is not large enough to afford a paying business great enough for New Brunswick to desert her general farming business in order to go into competition with other prolific sources of supply. If the province would continue to raise potatoes in a reasonable proportion she would find sufficient market near at hand, in Montreal and elsewhere, to make ample profits on potatoes while still realizing on other crops which are much more than worth while. "The Cuban potato trade has been a constant source of trouble to the banks. They are called upon to advance the expenses of shipment to a market which cannot be called a paying one if the past season is to be relied upon as a criterion. They have to put up the prices of barrels and the costly freightage, before the potatoes are shipped. If the goods are going to Montreal, they would go in bulk and the freightage, which would, of course, be much smaller, would be paid in Montreal."

Senator Baird has been attending the encanenia of the U.N.B., from which his son, Fred Baird, is a graduate this year in engineering. Mr. Baird will have charge of the Valley Railway survey from Woodstock north.

Speaking of the Valley road, Senator Baird said that the running of the line to Centreville would be something of a difficulty. A grade of one per cent from Woodstock to Centreville was, he thought, the nearest approach which could be made to the stipulated maximum of four-tenths of one per cent. This had been established by the surveys made years ago. A dominion subsidy had been voted, Senator Baird said, as long ago as when Fred Hale was a member of parliament, and a provincial subsidy had been obtainable for a similar period. Two surveys were made of this 24 mile piece of line, but attempts to finance it could not be successfully made, even with the assistance of the subsidy. Centreville had been crying for direct railroad connection for so long that it can hardly be passed by now.

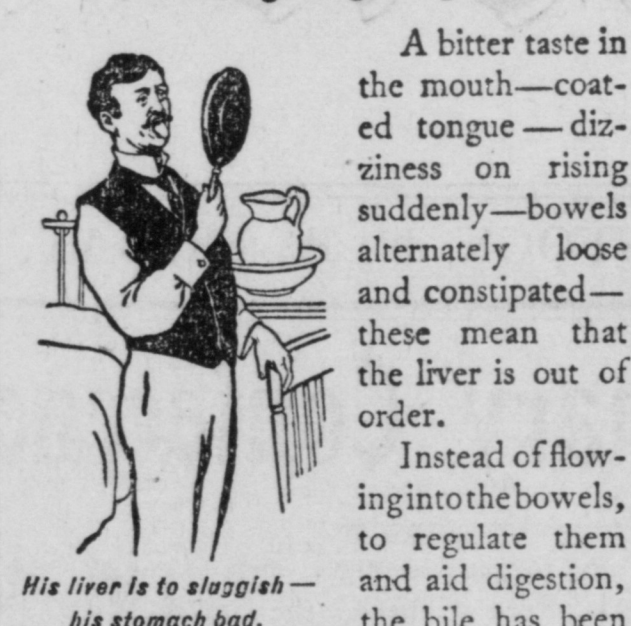

Dr. David Allison.

Notice has been given to the Board of Regents of Mount Allison University, by Dr. Allison, that he desires to be relieved of the presidency as soon as his successor can be obtained, and in any case not later than the end of the academic year. It is considered that Dr. Allison will remain for the next year, but it is arranged that a special meeting of the board will probably be held within a few weeks to deal with this situation. Dr. Allison is still active and vigorous, but he has reached an age when he feels justified in asking for release from the exacting duties of the administration.

The authorities of Mount Allison will, no doubt, find a capable successor to Dr. Allison, but it is hardly to be expected that another pre-ident of the university can fill the place in the public view that Dr. Allison has occupied. He was with the Mount Allison schools when they and he were young. He succeeded to the presidency when the schools were small compared to their present proportions, though relatively so important as they are now, since colleges were fewer and none were large. Called in the prime of life from the presidency of Mount Allison to the position of superintendent of education of Nova Scotia, at a time when the need of new life and vigor in the school administration of that province was recognized by enlightened people, he threw himself with enthusiasm into this service. After twelve busy years he was induced to return to his former position, as successor to Dr. Inch, who took the same office in New Brunswick which Dr. Allison had filled in Nova Scotia. Should Dr. Allison remain another year at Sackville he will have been a score of years in his second presidency. This makes a record of forty one years in two high administrative positions, following some ten previous years' work as teacher, or more than half a century of continuous educational work. In his earlier years Dr. Allison was a classical teacher. Later he held the chair in philosophy, and he has always been a strong advocate of the ancient academic training, though with such modifications as modern need demands. In his own reading and interests Dr. Allison is decidedly modern. He knows more politics than the politicians. He is better acquainted with religious history and development than the leaders of the church. He has handled large business matters connected with the management of a resident college like a man whose life has been given to business. He sometimes acts as arbitrator in labor disputes. He is always a delegate to the high courts of the Methodist Church. He presided over the largest educational congress ever held in this part of the world. There is no better authority than he on matters of local or general history. We have no men among us of whom it may be more truly said that there is nothing human foreign to him.

A man of singular frankness and simplicity of character, of most unselfish and generous disposition, of high motives and supreme devotion to his associates and friends, to his duties and convictions, and to his country, Dr. Allison is deserving of the remarkably high opinion which all men entertain of him. He is a man who has made and is making the most of life, and who has been doing more than his share of the work of the world with wholesome enjoyment on his own part, and with the approval of others.

### If You Have No Compass.

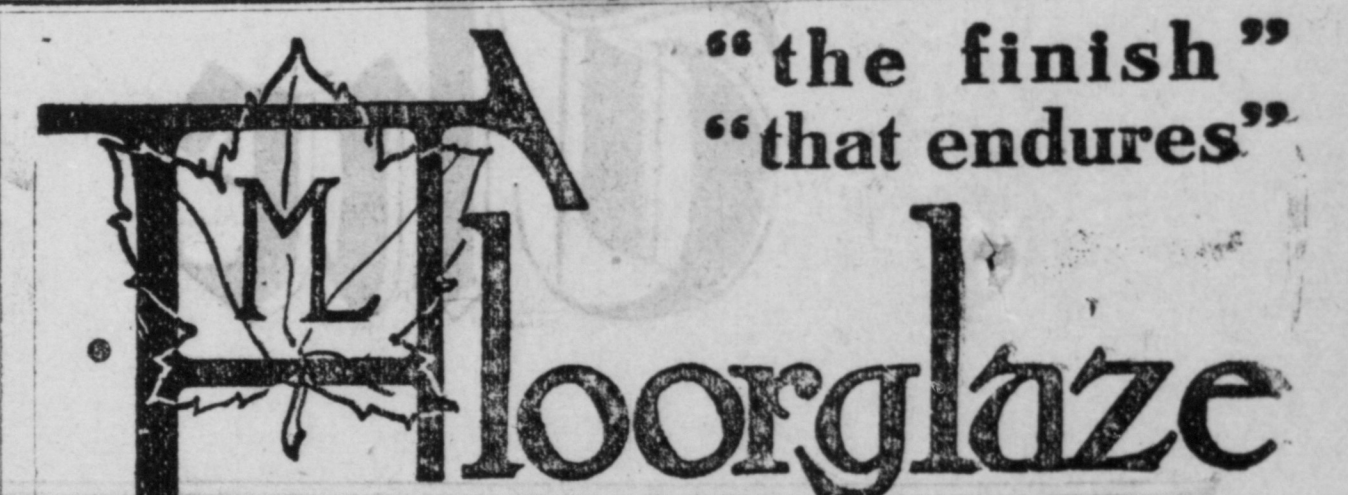
