TERRIBLE WORK OF DYNAMITE

Rewards of \$18,500 Offered For Clue to One Who Blew Up Newspaper Plant With Such Appalling Results.

Los Angeles, Oct 2-A large force of workmen, after digging for thirty hours into the debris of the Times building, wrecked by an explosion Saturday morning, have unearthed five of the nineteen bodies buried in the ruins. The men are still at work at night, aided by a huge railway crane and derrick, which is lifting

out the masses of heavy steel. In the meantime the police are guarding the home of General Harrison Gray Otis, proprietor of the Times, and that of General Manager Harry G Chandler. Guards are also watching over the plants of several concerns recently involved in strikes. Three arrests have been made since the explosion. One of the suspects is an alleged anarchist, Martin Eagan. 


