Charles Masters, a neighbor farmer, paid \$64.00 duty on four loads, and still realized \$15,00 over Canadian prices.

(2). E. J. Fream, secretary of the Alberta Farmers' Union, has returned from a visit to a machine firm across the line, endeavoring to make arrangements for cheaper agricultural machinery. Of course the western farmer will have to pay the duty on the machinery brought into Canada. (3). A bunch of Montana grass fed cattle, which had never been off the ranch sold on the Chicago market for \$7.90. They are selling here at less than \$5.00.
