

CORONATION

Ottawa, Oct. 9.-Militia orders to date contain among other things a copy of the despatch from the Imperial authorities to His Excellency requesting him to convey to His Min isters an expression of the gratitude of His Majesty's Government at receiving representatives of the military and naval forces of the overseas dominions for the purpose of taking fered like a martyr and thought often part in the coronation festivities, which have just terminated. The despatch also stated that the amassing of the contingents from all parts had a good effect in bringing together men from the widely separated portions of the Empire.

'A most favorable impression was created by the appearance of the troops on the Coronation Days, a well as at the parade at St. Paul's Cathedral on June 18, and also at the parade on the 30th of June, when His Majesty was pleased to present them with coronation medals,. h

The detachment from the 79th Highlanders of Canada were inspected by H. R. H. the Duke of Connaught at Aldershot. This detachment was granted the coronation medal in the same proportion as was Majesty's Government trusts that the troops will carry back with them a pleasant recollection of their visit.
