SIR JOHN A.'S CHAIR GIFT TO MR. BORDEN.

Was Used by Former Conservative Chief in His Law Office in Toronto—Now Sent to Ottawa.

Toronto, Oct. 6.—The old arm chair used by the late Sir John A. Macdonald during the years 1874 to 1878, when he was out of office and practising law in Toronto, has recently become the property of R. L. Borden, under romantic circumstances.

When the personnel of the law firm of Macdonald & Marsh changed, the old chair used by Sir John as senior partner,

passed into the possession of the new senior member of the firm, the late Wm. Lount, K. C. In 1900, when Mr. Lount was called to the bench, the chair was handed over to the junior member, George A. Kingston, the only Conservative member of the firm.

Some years later, Mr. Kingston, as secretary of the Borden Club of Toronto, attended a banquet given by the club in honor of the leader of the Conservative party. He asked Mr. Borden when he should be premier of Canada, to accept the present of the chair. Mr. Borden gave a ready assent and the chair has now been sent to Ottawa.

THE DEADLY GAME

Although at first blush many were ready to believe that Reciprocity was wholly responsible for the overthrow of the Laurier Government, it now transpires that other influences were set secretly in operation against the Liberal party which could not be combatted, so stealthily and insidiously were they exercised. There is reason to believe that the landslide in Ontario was due not so much to opposition to Reciprocity, nor to the appeal to loyalty, as to a wave of religious prejudice. Enough has been brought to light to show the despicable and dastardly character of the canvass which was used so successfully against Sir Wilfrid Laurier and in favor of Mr. Borden, not only in Ontario but in other sections of the Dominion where ultra-Protestant feeling could be aroused.

That the religious cry was a potent factor in the Ontario result is now admitted. An Ottawa correspondent of the New York Evening Post, dealing with the results, declares that over and above the feeling against Reciprocity and the apprehension of annexation:

"There has been an ever-growing feeling, more particularly confined to the Province of Ontario, against what is termed French-Canadian domination, as evidenced in a French-Canadian Catholic Premier and a Government dependent upon the Province of Quebec for its majority. This is a matter of common knowledge and is no secret. It has been felt for a number of years past that an undue amount of patronage went to Quebec, in conjunction with the much-veiled dual-language question, and this has rankled and irritated the Province of Ontario to an extent that few people outside the Province can appreciate. I need only draw attention to the editorials now appearing in certain of the Conservative papers, pointing out that at last there is a Government free from the domination of French Canada, as an evidence of what lies below the surface."

The Sentinel of Toronto, the organ of the Orange order, in its first issue after the election declared that chief among the other causes which operated to bring about the defeat of the Government "was an aroused Protestantism."

This was the cry that was raised against the Liberal Party in Ontario, as it had been raised in this and other Provinces, while in Quebec Sir Wilfrid was accused by fanatical opponents as a traitor to his race and religion. This time the old "double game" of the Tory Party did its deadly work. When honest Conservatives realize that they owe the victory of

their party in a large measure to the arousing of racial and sectarian prejudices, their jubilation will give place to shame. They may discover ere long that their success was too dearly bought.

STRONGLY OPPOSE NE TEMERE DECREE

Ten Thousand Documents.
Church Interference.

Toronto, Oct. 7.—With the Church courts of every denominational body committed to a policy of opposition towards the Ne Temere Decree, a new and powerful movement has been started by the Evangelical Alliance of Canada at a

meeting held in Toronto. Every leading Church of Canadian Protestantism was represented. Ten thousand documents will be issued at once, setting forth a case against the Decree.

A public educational campaign by means of a large mass meeting will be at once inaugurated. Finally a monster petition will be taken by a deputation to the Borden government and a demand will be made that the marriage laws of Canada will be placed beyond church interference.

POSITIONS OF GOVERNMENTS.

Premier Borden and his Cabinet will, in effect, be asked to set aside the Ne Temere Decree as an invasion of the rights of the Canadian Parliament and those of certain of the Provinces. Petitions will also be laid before every Provincial Government in the Dominion. As British Columbia and Prince Edward Island control their own marriage laws and retain the privilege of granting divorces, separate re-

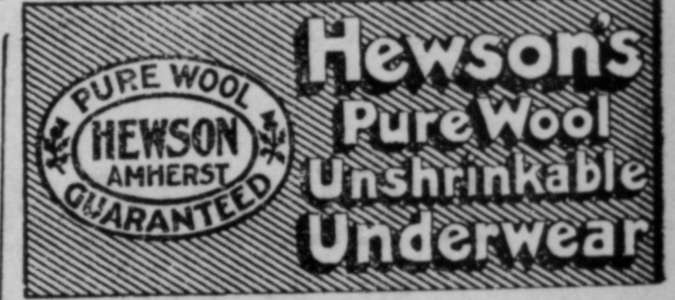
quests will be made of them. The Government of Ontario will be asked to take steps at the earliest possible moment to have the Court of Appeal determine the extent and jurisdiction of the Province, and of the Parliament of Canada on the subject of marriage laws.
