

The contract for printing the special issue of Canadian postage stamps to be known as the coronation issue, has been awarded to the American Bank Note Company, and it is expected that they will be distributed throughout the country by June 3rd, the King's birthday. These stamps will be double the size of the ordinary postage stamps, and only a limited number will be printed, as in the case of the Quebec tercentenary stamps. The new two-cent stamp for ordinary use, bearing the head of the new King, will not be ready for some time.

The multitudinous details connected with the Coronation of King George and Oueen Mary at Westminster Abbey on June 22nd has been practically settled.
