Get Married Quick Lady Faces Divorce.

The Matrimonial Experiences of Mrs. Elizabeth Rolfe Are Proving Serious.

Memphis, Tenn., Sept. 19.—Mrs. Elizabeth Ship Rolfe, who married one man in the afternoon and another that night and was freed of her first husband only after a legal battle, may be freed of her second for another, for he has filed suit for divorce.

On the morning of February 8, 1908, the slip of a girl was Miss Elizabeth Ship, eighteen, and beautiful. That afternoon at 3 o'clock she became Mrs. Harris Butler. A few hours later she married Joseph Rolfe.

It was not until the next day that clerks in the marriage license bureau noticed that two licenses had been issued in one day to Miss Elizabeth Ship. Reporters swarmed down upon her at the home of her second husband, and she told the story.

"I have loved Joe for a long, long time," she said. "I used to think I loved Mr. Butler, and I was engaged to him. After I met Joe I kept putting off Mr. Butler, who wanted to be married at once.

"My relatives finally took a hand and demanded that I marry the man I was engaged to. I protested, but they told me I did not know my own mind. They went ahead and made all arrangements for the wedding; Mr. Butler got the license, and I was called into the parlor, when everything was ready. Before I knew what was going on—really, I can't remember a thing about it—Mr. Butler was kissing me and calling me 'wife.'

"When the others had left us I began to realize my position. I made up my mind to join Joe. Excusing myself from Mr. Butler, I stepped to the kitchen, took the cook's coat and fled the house. I found Joe, and we decided to be married. I knew they couldn't make the first marriage stand. He got a license, through a friend, and we were married at his mother's home, and we're happy, aren't we, Joe?"

"Joe" affirmed that they were. Butler fought the case in the courts, but lost. The courts held that in the interests of public policy the later marriage must stand, as the first had been a mere ceremony.

But now "Joe" seems to have changed his mind. He charges desertion.

IS THIS THE STONE THAT MOSES STRUCK?

British Coronation Stone May Be the One of Biblical History

London, September 19.—One of the most amazing additions to the many stories surrounding the famous "Stone of Destiny" which for six centuries has reposed beneath the British Coronation chair, has just been made. The most familiar of the mediaeval legend traditions is that the stone was the one used by Joseph for his pillow at Bethel.

Preaching yesterday at Westminster Abbey, Archdeacon Wilberforce astonished the congregation by quoting a well known antiquarian who has specially studied stones, as saying that the "Stone of Destiny" is also the rock from which Moses struck water for the thirsting children of Israel.

The name of the antiquarian was not given by Archdeacon Wilberforce, but he was quoted as saying that he was convinced the stone was as such it was considered as sacred and was carried from place to place by the Israelites in their wanderings in the wilderness. The antiquarian showed to Archdeacon Wilberforce a cleft in the back of the rock from which he said he believed the water had gushed after Moses had struck the stone with his staff. The stone, it is believed, was taken from the Temple of Solomon, and, after its destruction, to Jerusalem. From Jerusalem it was taken by Titus to Spain. Thence it reached Ireland, later it was taken to Scotland, and was brought to London by Edward I.

The woman who sews is very often annoyed by having the thread twist into knots, especially if she is using a long thread. BIG RAILROAD STRIKE ON IN IRELAND

Three Great Systems Are Affected—Rioting Begins

Dublin, Sept. 18.—The general strike declared last night on the Great Southern & Western Railroad is spreading over three great systems—the Great Southern, the Midland Great Western and the Great Northern. All were affected today and the services generally were demoralized. Some of the main line trains were being operated in charge of apprentices and clerks. The strikers hurled stones at the trains and tried to shoot a signalman who refused to leave his box.

A general meeting of railroad men has been called here tonight to decide whether to declare a national strike. A special meeting of the executives of the Amalgamated Society of Railway Servants will be held tomorrow to deal with the situation.

AT THE TRADES AND LABOR CONGRESS.

CALGARY, Alta., Sept. 15.—The Trades and Labor Congress has agreed to the following resolutions without discussion:

Stipendiary magistrates to try cases of miners accused of violence or intimidation.

Promotion of a better demand for union label goods.

Bringing of Chinese laundries within the factory act.

In the event of passage of the eight-hour day bill, employers be compelled to pay a living wage.

In favor of technical and industrial education, but not in favor of trade schools.

To prohibit sub-letting of building contracts.

Lengthening of sections on railroads to the detriment of workmen and the travelling public.

Requesting the government to appoint a royal commission to discuss causes of many fatal accidents.

More sanitary methods of packing nails.

Expressing appreciation of the efforts of the Canada Carpet Weavers in their struggle for the right to organize.

Advocate fortnightly pay.

Seeking legislation to make discrimination by employers a criminal offence.

Asking the government to appoint fire bosses in mines.

The auditing of municipal accounts in the same manner as those of the post office and express companies.

Resolution No. 97, proposing reciprocity in cut and rough stone between Canada and the United States was handed over to the executive to take such action as in their judgment necessary.

Special resolution, No. 2, to promote an organization among the workers of the Dominion Coal & Steel Company, was agreed to after the House proposing a per capita tax of five cents was struck out.

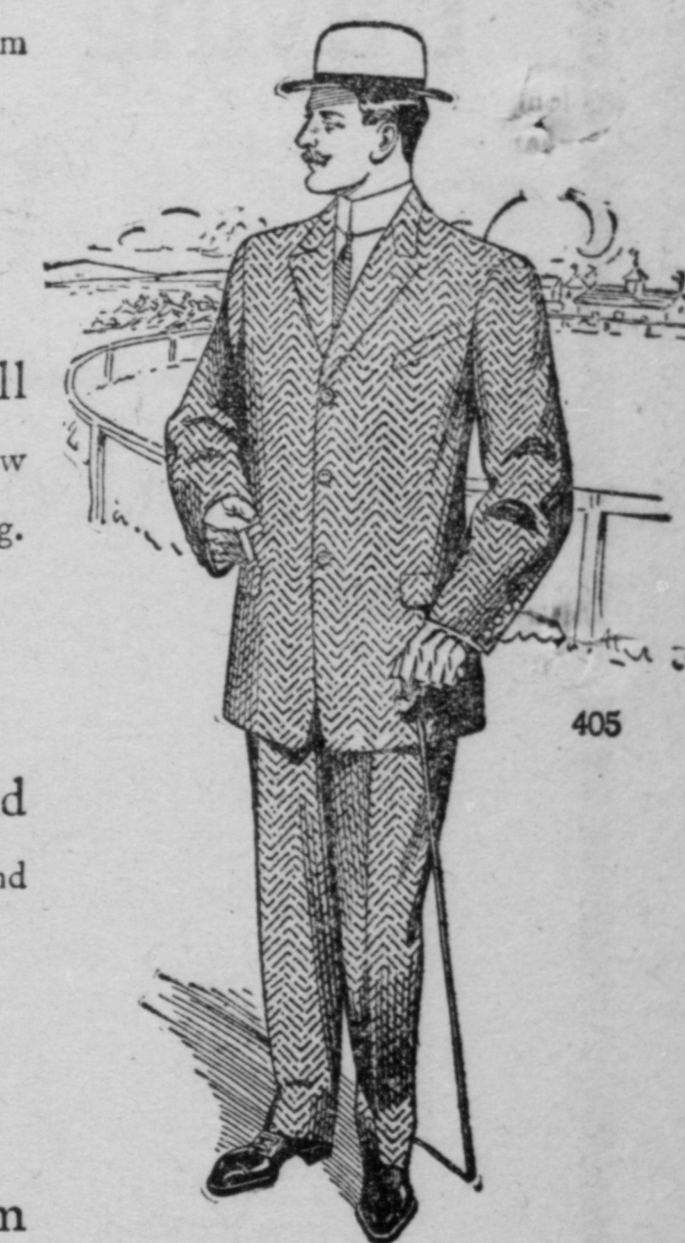
This concluded the report of the committee on resolutions, and on a motion it was adopted as a whole.
