

Activity in Fruit Industry.

A new feature in farming in New Brunswick is announced. Several Sunbury County men, one from Quebec and one from St John are seeking incorporation as the St John Valley & Fruit Land Company, with \$48,000 capital. They will conduct a general orchard and nursery business. At Woodstock last week the Carleton County Fruit Growers' Association was formed, for the purpose of stimulating co-operative work in that fine fruit growing country. It is only within the last few years that the immense possibilities in fruit-raising have taken hold of the minds of New Brunswick farmers, and the field is one of the most inviting offered to the investor in agricultural industry.

Immigrants For New Brunswick

While as yet the Canadian Northern Railway has not reached down into New Brunswick, it is expected to do so. In the meantime, Thomas Howell, of the immigration service of that railway, has had an interview with Premier Hazen before proceeding to London, and secured a letter to Mr. Bowdler, the New Brunswick immigration agent in London. Mr. Howell states that he hopes to divert to the Maritime Province a considerable number of desirable settlers who might otherwise go to the West. One of the problems that is being widely and seriously considered in New Brunswick is that of making agriculture more attractive to its own people, and securing a good class of farmers from the Old Country as new settlers.



C. P. R. to Spend 1,000,000 at St John

A Montreal dispatch repeats the statement made in previous correspondence that the Canadian Pacific Railway is planning to spend more than a million dollars on terminals on its newly acquired property at the head of St John harbour, and that it contemplates a twice-a-day service across the Bay of Fundy, with two fast trains per day between St John and Montreal. It is stated here that the company are about to call for tenders for \$100,000 worth of wharf timber. Traffic by this route to and from Nova Scotia will rapidly develop as a result of the acquisition by the Canadian Pacific of the Dominion Atlantic railway and steamer service.

Many Immigrants Landing at St John

The trans-Atlantic steamers are now pouring into St John, en route to Western Canada, thousands of immigrants, many of whom bring with them considerable capital. They come from different parts of Europe, and some cannot speak English. One steamer landed over a thousand immigrants last week, and all the Canadian Pacific steamers have all their second and third class passages booked ahead from now till the first of May, while the Allan, Donaldson and other lines will swell the volume of new citizens pouring in through the port of St John. The very excellent facilities for handling this traffic enables the Canadian Pacific Railway to rush the newcomers westward within a remarkably short period after the steamships tie up at the docks. For this great immigrant traffic St John is in winter the front door of Canada, as it is also for the winter export and import trade of the country.

With aching heart we laid her Beneath the churchyard sod, Just one body laid to rest, But another spirit is with it God.


