### ST. JOHN CITY AND ITS PARTS OF GENERAL INTEREST.

By Sgt. J. Roxborough, 10th C. F. A. St. John is the most populous and progressive City of the Canadian Maritime Provinces. It is prominent as a commercial centre and the home of many industries; but it is from the fact that it has an ice free harbour that gives it prominence as the Winter Port of N. B. To give the reader some idea of the enormous amount of business done here would require us to give a few figures. During the winter season, from November to April 1109-10, there were 114 sailings of Transatlantic steamers from this port carrying away \$24,080,007 worth of exports, also lumber shipments amounting to \$1,059,251. The city is situated at the mouth of the noble river of the same name, which is navigable for upwards of 100 miles, with a population of upwards of 51,000, has excellent Street railway service, railway and steamship service in all directions and is the largest trade distributing centre in the Maritime provinces. There are seventeen banks a splendidly equipped fire department, an effective police department, numerous fine buildings, including a free public library building, erected at the cost of \$50,000, forty-four churches, representing eleven denominations, five daily newspapers, Y. M. C. A. building, etc.

### THE LA TOUR CANNON.

On Queen Square may be seen a relic of French occupation. It is believed to have been formerly mounted upon the ancient fortifications erected by the French, and some assert that at one time it formed part of the armament of Port La Tour. When Colonel Moncton on Sept. 23th, 1758, took possession of the old French Fort, he most certainly made use of what material remained of its former defences which no doubt included the old gun. It also seems probable, that when Fort Frederick was dismantled, the old cannon was removed to Kings Batteries at Reed's Point. It was found in 1895 by some workmen who were excavating for the foundation of a large building near the site of the Old Graveyard Battery, and was formally presented by its rescuer Col. A. J. Armstrong to the New Brunswick Historical Society, who in turn presented it to the City in June 1906, on the anniversary of the discovery of St. John by Champlain. On the same square is also noticeable the Monument of Samuel de Champlain, who discovered the St. John river. On King Square the tourist may see the monument of Sir Leonard Tilley and the Band Stand.

### THE REVERSING FALLS.

Passing along Main Street, and out of the City via Douglas Ave., it is but a few minutes car ride to a narrow and high walled gorge, where a mighty river with many tributaries (in themselves rivers), which has wound its way 450 miles through the most fertile section of the Province, here tumbles over a mass of boulders, and loses itself in the Bay of Fundy. When the tide is at low ebb there is a fall of about fifteen feet toward the harbour. When the tide returns it overcomes the river tide and makes a fall in the opposite direction. The river is here spanned by two bridges, viz., The Suspension and the Cantilever. The former has a span of about 640 feet, and accommodates both teams and pedestrians. It is a unique piece of engineering. The latter, close beside it, has a span of 477 feet and is said to be seventy feet above the highest tide. Over this passes C. P. R. trains. Close to the Falls there is a mammoth pulp mill, one of the largest in Canada and also one of the finest lumber mills in the Province.

### MARTELLO TOWER.

The most conspicuous, as well as the most historical monument of the past century crowns the summit of Carleton Heights. This is Martello Tower. The Caretaker tells us it was built in 1812 by the Royal Engineers and the 104th Regiment of Foot. Its walls I should judge are six feet thick and the stones used in its construction, we are told, were conveyed by the troops in handbarrows many feet below. The building is in an excellent state of preservation, and contains many old relics and souvenirs of the past century. The view from this point is fine.

### MARKET SLIP

At the foot of King street, and making the actual landing place of the Loyalties, is situated Market Slip. Here on May 18th 1783, disembarked three thousand loyal and determine souls, the founders of St. John.

### PARTRIDGE ISLAND.
