JOSHUA'S LONG DAY

The supreme authority over the nation and the army had been given by Moses to Joshua. Joshua was a man about forty years younger than Moses and seems to have been born about the time Moses died to Media. Joshua was thus in the prime of his life, and being a warrior he was well able to carry on the conquest of Canaan. His fidelity and courage had been tested as one of the spies who had swam the Jordan to view the city of Jericho and report on the possibility of its being taken by the Israelites. Joshua's and Caleb's report of the taking of Jericho was favourable; but as this paper is not intended to describe the taking of Jericho we will pass along to Joshua's battle with the five kings and his account of the sun and the moon standing still; so as to have time to finish his work.

Whether Joshua's account of the sun and moon standing still should be taken literally or figuratively has perplexed many Bible students. We would not attempt to limit the power of God for that being who made the Heavens and the earth could so effect the apparent motion of the sun so as to prolong the day that Joshua might have time to defeat the five Kings or Amarithes.

We should take into consideration

that in the time of Joshua the people had no knowledge of the same and that the sun was actually standing still in the heaven at the time Joshua asked the Lord to prolong the day; is the sun and moon to stand still. Even if Joshua understood that the sun had no motion in the heavens, the time had not come when the same should be explained to the people, and therefore Joshua recorded this great event as it would appear to the people or in a way that would seem to them reasonable.

Certainly a great event took place when Joshua defeated the five kings but we must remember that the Scriptures tell us that God fought this battle for Joshua; but we are indebted to Joshua for a record of the different events that took place and we think that Joshua's reference to the sun and moon standing still will admit of a figurative explanation and in no way conflict with the Scripture narrative.

The circumstances leading to the battle with the five kings freely discredited are as follows:

The Gibeonites a powerful tribe living about twenty miles distant from Gilead on the plains of Jordan and Joshua's headquarters for a time after the taking of Jericho and he no doubt had heard of the crossing of the Jordan and what had happened at Jericho, and he feared for their own safety, and were anxious to make peace with Joshua. By presenting to Joshua old dried up battle mounds and old garments they made it appear that they were from a far off country and wished to make a league with Joshua and Joshua without consulting the Lord made peace with them and promised them protection. Joshua soon found out the fraud practised upon him, but still considered them under his protection; yet as a punishment for their fraud they were doomed to perpetual servitude and made hewers of wood and drawers of water for the services at the temple, and then the protection they secured from the Israelites would seem to have been dearly bought.

Joshua's command was to utterly destroy the Canaanites, but he only partly did his work. He not only spared the Gibeonites but other tribes who lived he considered too

far distant to cause trouble, but in this he was mistaken. The Philistines in particular proved to be troublesome neighbors. In the time of Eli they defeated the Israelites in a battle and carried the Ark of God into a strange country, which had such an effect on old Eli the High Priest that when it was announced to him that the Ark of God was taken the announcement had such an effect upon him that he fell from his elevated seat a dead man.

Five tribes of the Canaanites ruled over by as many Kings were dissatisfied with the Gibeonites for making peace with Joshua and proceeded to punish them. In haste word was sent to Joshua at Gilead by the Gibeonites for protection and before sunrise next morning Joshua was at the foot of the hill upon which Gibeon stood with his fighting men. The five kings with their armies had also arrived. The Israelites with their sudden war cry rushed forward and a general panic took place. The road the five kings took with their armies was one of the most rough and uneven to be found in that part of the country. It was simply a pass through narrow gorges and between high hills which rendered the way quite dark even when the sunshine shone. While trying to make their escape they were overtaken by one of those great storms so subject to the country, and the Scripture tells us that there were more killed by the hail than by the sword. Different accounts have come down to us in reference to these storms and the danger of being exposed to them. We have an account of an army trying to pass through this narrow gorge when overtaken by one of these storms and nearly exterminated by the great hail storm that took place. We are informed that hail in the eastern countries often falls from one-half to three fourths of an inch in weight which certainly would prove fatal to those exposed to the storm.

The great storm had made the passage between the hills quite dark and to all appearance night was near at hand and the five kings with their fighting men to all appearance were liable to escape before Joshua accomplished his work. We should take into consideration that Joshua and his men had travelled all the previous night over the rough roads and had probably pursued the Canaanites over thorough roads until about the middle of the afternoon and were certainly in an exhausted and tired condition and to tired men the day had seemed long and the darkness caused by the storm caused them to think that night was near at hand and read that Joshua spoke to the Lord in sight of all Israel, sun stand now still upon Gibeon and throw moon in the valley of Hecyon and the sun stood still and the moon stayed until the people avenged themselves upon their enemies. Now if we understand this great event that took place just as it reads then we must confess that for a time the earth did not revolve on its axis. God certainly could cause even this to take place, but it would seem that he would have devised a more simple means to defeat the Amarithes in a way that would not conflict with the harmony of this work of creation.

Joshua tells us that he spoke to the Lord in the sight of Israel, when he made his prayer. Now there was only a small part of Israel present at the time. Two tribes had never crossed the Jordan and he certainly must have left a large body of the Israelites at Gilead, his headquarters, at the time, so when Joshua refers to Israel he simply meant his fighting men. At Joshua's prayer certainly a remarkable event took place; but why not understand that

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within five miles of his homestead on a farm at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section of available land, at \$10.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the required 60 days homestead period) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchase homestead in any district. Price \$10.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a home worth \$100.00.

event; that the storm that had darkened the heavens cleared and the sun came out which was still quite high up in the heavens and there was still time to defeat the Amarithes before the close of the day and thus Joshua's prayer would be answered. And may have in some way lightened up the night so as in appearance to prolong the day and thus the battle would have been partly fought in the night which would appear to his fighting men as a prolonged day.

Joshua in his reference to this battle with the Amarithes says: It is not written in the Book of Joshua, nor did Joshua mean that an account of this battle with the Amarithes would be found written in the Book of Joshua, certainly not, for the Book of Joshua was written before the battle with the Amarithes or the five kings was fought. Now what is meant by the Book of Joshua? This Book consisted of odes or poems in praise of heroes and a record of great events. Many of them greatly exaggerated and others only existed in imagination, and were compared to some of the events mentioned in the Book of Joshua, which were compared equal to the sun and moon standing still. Now as the Book of Joshua was an inspired book but considered chiefly of the praise of heroes and great events. Joshua, certainly did not mean that his quotation from that book should be understood literally, but simply that a great event had taken place equal to some of the events mentioned in that book.

We are informed by a traveler who had visited the place when Joshua defeated the Amarithes that late in the afternoon the sun would not be over Gibeon, neither the moon over the valley of Hecyon which would seem to further confirm the impression that Joshua's quotation from the Book of Joshua should not be understood literally but figuratively. When we consider that the sun was actually standing still in the heavens and that he compared his five fighting men to a large body of people known as Israel and also consider that he quoted from an inspired book that rests on no authority in divine matters we feel justified in saying that Joshua's statement of the sun and moon standing still will admit of a figurative explanation. Joshua recorded the events that took place as they seemed to the people in that day, when they were ignorant of the sciences. The old Hebrew writers made many bold statements which we would not think of understanding literally and Joshua's record of the great event that took place at Gibeon may be considered one of them.

The Scriptures tell us that there was no day like it or after it, that the Lord harkened unto the voice of a man, for the Lord fought for Israel. It was certainly a wonderful day. It was a wonderful day to the Amarithes. The sun worshiped by them as a God became darkened by the storm and caused them to think that the sun, one of their Gods was frowning upon them. These five kings were hanged and the cave which they intended for the asylum became their sepulchre. It was a wonderful day to the Israelites. It was a day of battle between Heaven and the powers of darkness. The God of Israel prevailed over the Gods of the Amarithes and the way opened up for an easy conquest of the land promised to the descendants of Abraham about five hundred years previous and from which they had been kept so long from entering on account of the rebellious spirit of their forefathers.
