CENSUS ENUMERATORS AT WORK

Many Questions Will be Asked During the Next Month

By the time that this week's issue of the SENTINEL is in the hands of its readers the census enumerators will have begun their work throughout the county. Col W C Good is the commissioner in charge of the men and has been busy during the past few weeks getting his men instructed in their work and completing all the details for a speedy performance of this heavy task.

Every family, every dwelling and every place of business throughout the county will be visited by these enumerators and the necessary questions in order to elicit the desired information will be asked. It might be well for us to remind our readers that in order to get a full and satisfactory statement of the present conditions it will be necessary for every person to give the fullest information possible. This information is strictly confidential the enumerator and the commissioner having been sworn to secrecy. -Owing to the large number of questions to be asked and the territory to be covered it will greatly aid the work if the residents will answer quickly and briefly the questions asked. The answers will have no effect upon your taxes nor your standing in the community.

Insurance upon life, against accident or sickness and the cost of insurance for 1910.
Can you read, can you write, what language commonly spoken.
Schedule No 2.
All dates in 1910 to be recorded.
SCHEDULE NO 3
For heads of family, houses and buildings.

Dwellings, occupied land.
Total acres occupied.
Acres improved.
Acres in natural forest or unbroken prairie.
Acres in orchard, number of bearing trees.
Acres in vegetables, wheat and all kinds of grain, acres in pasture.
Value of farm, land and all crops.

This is intended to be a thorough statistical report for the Minister of Agriculture and any information given is not to be taken to assessors of the town or county for taxation.
