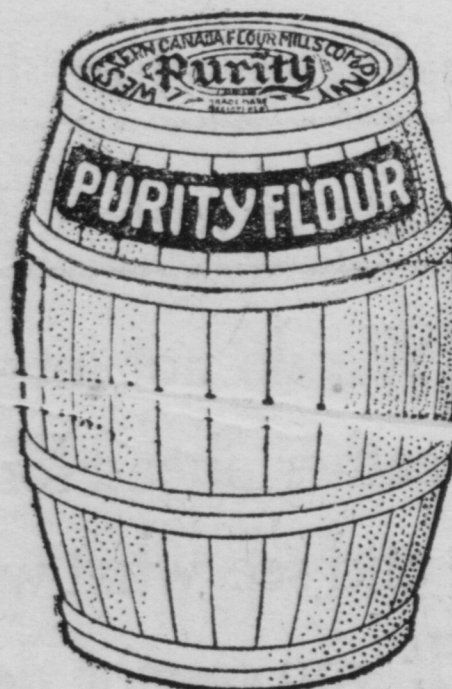

ESSAY ON THE DOMINION.

(By pupil of East Newbridge School.)

Three cheers for Canada, hurrah! hurrah! hurrah!

This fair Dominion of ours extends from the cold and icy regions of the Arctic ocean to the north to the United States, Great Lakes and St Lawrence River on the south, and from the turbulent waters of the Atlantic on the east to the peaceful ones of the Pacific on the west. Canada forms about one-third of the whole British Empire, covering over three and one-half million square miles, which accommodate over five and one-half million people. Why should we not be proud to be citizens of Fair Canada.

On a bright day in August, when the Express comes into Woodstock, N. B. with its whoop, I am counted among the passengers and go flying along the steel rails up that far-famed river St John, so named by Champain and De Monts, who first visited it on the day of "St John the Baptist," June 24th, 1604. I pass on to the beautiful Grand Falls, which rush down a gorge of 74 feet, and rank with the finest of any continent, attracting visitors from all parts. I go on up the Canadian Pacific Railway until I reach Edmundston; here I change cars, taking the Temiscouata Branch until I reach River Du Loup, which is situated near the Intercolonial Railway. I change cars and pass on down the bank of the St Lawrence river, which is the chief artery of Canada.

The first city I reach is the beautiful one of Montreal, which is situated on an island bearing the same name, in the St Lawrence River, near the mouth of the Ottawa river. Then we go up the banks of the Ottawa about 100 miles and we come into the city of Ottawa, which is the seat of the Dominion Government. The Parliament buildings are situated on a high bluff overlooking the river below, and they are noted for their beauty. In passing through the Province of Ontario I travel along the large blue sheet of water, Lake Superior, which is the largest body of fresh water in the world. I travel on until I reach the city of Winnipeg, which is at the junction of the Red River and Assiniboine in the Province of Manitoba. It was only in 1870 that the Province of Manitoba was laid out, and the half breeds living there at that time were not consulted and this caused jealousy; so the Mounted Police force was established in 1873 to preserve the laws and order in the North West. It was chiefly from this body of men, trained in this force, that the "Strathcona Horse Company" was enlisted for the war in South Africa in 1900. I then pass through the provinces of Saskatchewan and Alberta, and as I fly along over the valuable, level and beautiful prairies, there are great numbers of men engaged in harvesting and threshing the grain. Then the railway crosses the lofty and green "Rocky Mountains" at Banff, whose beauty surpasses any other spot in the Dominion.

I travel through British Columbia, until at last the conductor calls out "Vancouver City," and I pile off among many other passengers to spend a few days in Vancouver, which is the western terminus of the Canadian Pacific Railway. Then I come back the same route until I reach Montreal, after which I cross Maine and come into Fredericton Junction, then I go north until I reach Fredericton City, which is situated on the right bank of the St John River, about 84 miles from its mouth and is the capital of the province. It is a most beautiful city, having broad and level streets shaded by elms and has many fine buildings, among which are the Parliament Buildings, Provincial University and Normal School. I then come up the O.P.R., what is commonly known as the Gibson Branch, to Newburg Jet, then down to Woodstock. Here I am home again, and the verdant woodlands I left have been tinged by Fair Nature's wand making it one broad sheet of red and gold.

Thirty years ago there was not a mile of railway west of the province of Ontario. Now the railroads form a network of railways, touching most every important business centre.

The industries of Canada are:—Agriculture, lumbering, mining, fishing, fur trade and manufacturing. The chief department of agriculture is grain growing. All the most useful grains can be gathered from Canadian soil; but the broad and level prairies of the west are chiefly adapted for wheat growing and this important grain is also a staple farm product of Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Quebec and it is raised to a certain extent in New Brunswick. The province of Ontario is an excellent fruit growing region and has an area in orchards of not less than 320,000 acres. In the Niagara peninsula and along the western shores of Lake Erie the delicious peaches are found in great abundance; here also hanging in great clusters are the precious grapes. The beautiful valleys of Annapolis and Cornwallis in Nova Scotia are especially adapted for fruit growing. The juicy peaches, tasteful plums, choicest cherries and the great varieties of apples are grown there in great abundance. Canada produces in vast quantities all kinds of lumber. It is chiefly carried on in the province of British Columbia, Quebec, Ontario and New Brunswick, and in Nova Scotia it is of some importance. Spruce logging as it is called is carried on in New Brunswick in the winter for the people of the back settlement are engaged in farming in the summer, but in the winter they go to the lumber woods and through the months of Dec, Jan, Feb and March their axes and saws are felling the valuable and lofty trees and they haul them to the nearest streams by horses and in the spring the rains and the melting snows loose the fetters and turn the streams to torrents. The logs are then carried down to the saw mill at the mouth of the river. In British Columbia lumbering is the most important industry; the largest tree being the "Douglas Fir" which very often is from 200 to 300 ft. in height, having a diameter of 8 or 10 ft. is another tree of very great importance in the west. Mining is another industry of much value in Canada and is carried on to a great extent in the provinces of Nova Scotia, British Columbia and Ontario. The most valuable gold mines are the Klondike in the Yukon District. Nearly all the other minerals are found in Canada. The Fur Trade has always occupied a prominent place in Canadian history, much of the exploration of this fair Dominion of ours is due to these hardy and adventurous fur-traders. Of the world's great fisheries those of Canada are the greatest and most varied; the salt waters of the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans and the countless fresh water lakes and rivers, for Canada is a network of waterways, all teem with fish of commercial value.

Another industry which is carried on to a great extent in Canada is "Manufacturing." Everything we use from boots up to mill machinery is now made in our own country.

Now out balancing all of this luxury is the great freedom which all of our citizens are enjoying and which we owe to that great line of monarchs of which at present our good faithful, true and honest King George V. is reigning, and may he have a long, happy, and prosperous life and may there never be a shadow drawn over this government "Of the people, for the people and by the people."

Let us all then try to be more loyal and love this glorious country of ours with a deeper love and be still more proud when we see the flying colors of our noble flag, "Red, White and Blue," which waves on

appropriate days throughout the Dominion.

FORESTRY IN EUROPE

The productive forest area in 1908 on the Grand Duchy of Hesse in Europe amounted to 182,253 acres. In general the standing timber is composed of sixty-nine percent hardwood and thirty-one percent coniferous species. The total yield of lumber in 1908 was 4,375,000 cubic feet. Refuse in so far as it is not suitable for lighter lumber, such as lath or for pulp, is used for firewood. The expenditures for salaries, forest cultivation and road building amounted to approximately \$754,000, and the total gross income (from lumber and firewood) was \$1,161,031. The capital represented by the forests (\$52,665,354) brought interest accordingly at 2.21 percent. Where extensive forestry of this kind is practised, forest fires are unknown. Sufficient money spent on Canadian Forest Reserves would greatly reduce the fire danger, maintain an adequate lumber supply for the country and in time become a source of revenue to the Government.
