THE ADVANCE IN HAY

Read This and Then Think of the Conservative Contention That the American Market Will Not Take Canadian Hay.

The Trade Bulletin, Montreal, Says:—"It is many years since the price of hay sold as high as \$32.00 per ton for prime, and \$31.00 for No. 1 in car lots in New York, but these were the prices obtained in that city on Monday last and as high as \$29.00 and \$30.00 was made for choice clover, mixed. No 2 timothy brought \$28.00 to \$29.00 and No 3 \$26.00 to \$27.00, whilst ordinary clover mixed sold at \$25.00. These are pretty high figures for even high toned New York. A firm in that city writing to a dealer here under Saturday's date stated that the pinch it was feared was not yet over.

In this market a further advance of \$1.00 per ton has been established, No 1 being quoted at \$20.00 and choice No 2 at \$18.00 to \$19.00, ordinary No 2 at \$16.50 to \$17.50 and clover mixed \$15.50 to \$16.00. Supplies, it is claimed, will be pretty restricted between now and the first of June, both the new fields and the old meadows having made no start yet, as the season is from two to three weeks late. Their growth has also been impeded by heavy frosts at night, and until warmer and more genial weather sets in, no improvement in growth can be expected.

Americans are busy securing all the Canadian hay they can find at country points from No 1 down to clover mixed and clover; in fact any grade they can come across in the shape of merchantable fodder. They are paying fully as high prices at country points, as can be realized in this market, and in some instances even higher rates are being paid for shipment to the American market."

Some Household "Don'ts" to Prevent Fire

Don't leave everything to the landlord; inspect your own house from cellar to garret and locate all exits.
Don't throw cigars or cigarettes out of windows. They drop on awnings and set them afire.
Don't allow children to play with matches.
Don't use matches or candles in dark closets or cellars.
Don't keep matches except in a tin box with cover attached.
Don't toss away a match unless completely extinguished, and then toss it into a metal or porcelain receptacle.
Don't fill lamps or oil stoves while lighted.
Don't use kerosene oil in lighting fires.
Don't use naphtha or gasoline for cleaning purposes where there are open lights or fires.
Don't put hot ashes on a dumb waiter.
Don't accumulate old beds or bedding or other trash in cellars.
Don't neglect to have the chimney flue cleaned once a year. You are responsible, not your landlord.

IN THE GARDEN

What is home without a garden?
It is a good idea in growing tender flowers from seeds to plant the seeds early in a box of rich earth set in the kitchen window and transplant after May 24.

Dahlia bulbs should be started growing in boxes under glass in March, and set out in April after taking off the cuttings. They can safely be put in the open garden after May 24.

A good summering flowering bulb is the autumn crocus that opens its clusters of purple and white in September. The bulbs can be planted in May in the garden. They do well at the root of a tree.

An early start is the secret of success with sweet peas. Sow as early as you can get on the ground. Plant the seeds not less than two inches deep, and one or two inches apart in the row. Peas do best if planted where they get the morning sun.
