THE ART EXHIBITION.

Woodstock's First Art Loan Exhibition, held under the efficient management of the ladies of the W. C. T. U., last week, was a surprise to all who attended it. The amount of good work exhibited would do credit to a much larger city, and shows that in the fine Arts Woodstock compares favorably with any city in the Province. The work of those who have studied in the conservatories and art schools at Halifax, New York, Boston and St. John, would rank high at any art exhibition, and that of the young aspirants, though crude in some respects, shows in many cases undoubted talent.

Of original work, Miss Alice Connell's Study in still life, red drapery back ground with statuary; Gloxinias The iron works at Upper Woodstock; Collection of water color sketches of local scenery, are all worthy of special notice.

Mrs. Marcy's collection—A child's portrait from life in water colors, is a fine study; The camp of 1888 at Doherty's field is easily recognized; two portraits, copied and enlarged from photo, in ink and crayon, are excellent; Study in still life, suspended ball, is very good.

Miss Alice Bull's Blue Rock, Carleton, St. John, has a fine atmosphere effect; A study in vegetables is very true to nature; Mending the net, copy from an original painting, is very fine; a sailor was also very much admired.

Miss Ida Connell's study in fruit was good; Dog, from life, was recognized as a familiar canine; Hen and chickens; Sitting ducks, etc., were very good.

Miss Pitt's picture of the Stand Pipe was a charming bit of familiar scenery; Moonlight at sea, copy, in black and white, was finely executed; A winter landscape, copy, good also.

Miss Raymond's Study in still life, crimson drapery back ground with vase, books on table, was very fine; Study in pansies, water colors, also very good.

Miss Florence Smith's calla lily, from nature, is very fine; Shipwreck, copy, were much admired.

Miss Appleby's study in block charcoal is excellent; Deer, copy, very fine.

Miss Baird, marine scene, Yacht Bantam, in water colors, a charming study.

Miss Emma Slipp, study in yellow roses, very attractive.

Mrs. J. C. Winslow's Jew "Rescued" and Flower Girl in crayons, are beautiful in softness of finish, and correctness of expression; the "Madonna" in pastels is a lovely study.

Mrs. Walter Fisher's windmill scene copy, is a beautiful picture, with a delicacy of finish unsurpassed. Miss Gertrude Lugin's Moonlight scene, copy, is very fine. Miss Marion Lumming's sketch of Tobique bridge, is true to nature. Miss Annie Fisher's table, painted on slate, is excellent.

Miss Louise Allan's study in draperies of rich white watered silk, corded silks and silk bolton cloth, painted in Tapestry painting. They were lovely.

Miss Fisher, two draperies, one chair rest; Mrs. W. D. Camber, a winter scene, much admired. Mrs. F. W. Webster's water scene, copy, and porcelain painting were very good.

Max D. Cormier has openly stated that he is applying for the position of registrar of deeds, to replace D. O. Bourgois, the present registrar, and has requested the latter to resign.

This week's issue of the Royal Gazette contains a notice of the appointment of Willie T. Perron as police magistrate of the town of Edmundston, in place of Joseph T. Martin, alleged to be removed from office for cause. The appointment of Mr. Perron is replacing the better man by the worse, and by one entirely inexperienced in the work. No complaint was made against Mr. Martin and no investigation has been held. Mr. Martin gave general satisfaction and did not meddle in politics.

WALNUT FUDGE.

2 cups brown sugar, 1 cup milk, 4 tablespoons butter, 1 teaspoon vanilla, cook sugar and milk to the soft ball stage, remove from the fire, then add vanilla, butter and 1 cup chopped walnuts. Beat until it will just pour into buttered pans. Before it is cool cut in squares.

Insane Brothers Meet in Asylum

Toronto, Oct. 18.—A dramatic incident is reported from Mimico Asylum for the Insane. At a religious service held on Sunday morning, one of the patients, Alexander Hills, aged 35, suddenly pointed at another patient, and said: "That is my brother." No attention was paid to him at first, but he persisted in his statement. Investigation proved that the other patient was Harry Hills, aged 30, who went to Fernie, B. C., many years ago and was thought to have perished in the fire of July 31, 1908, as his relatives had heard nothing of him since that time. His mind had become affected and he crossed to the Western States, where the authorities deported him on learning that he originally came from Toronto.

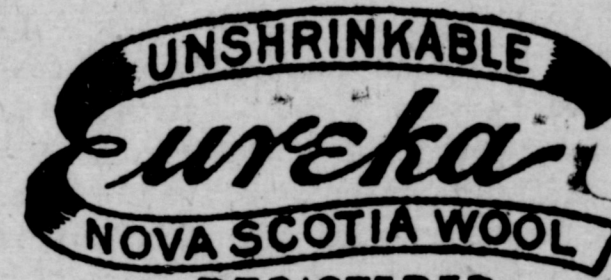
