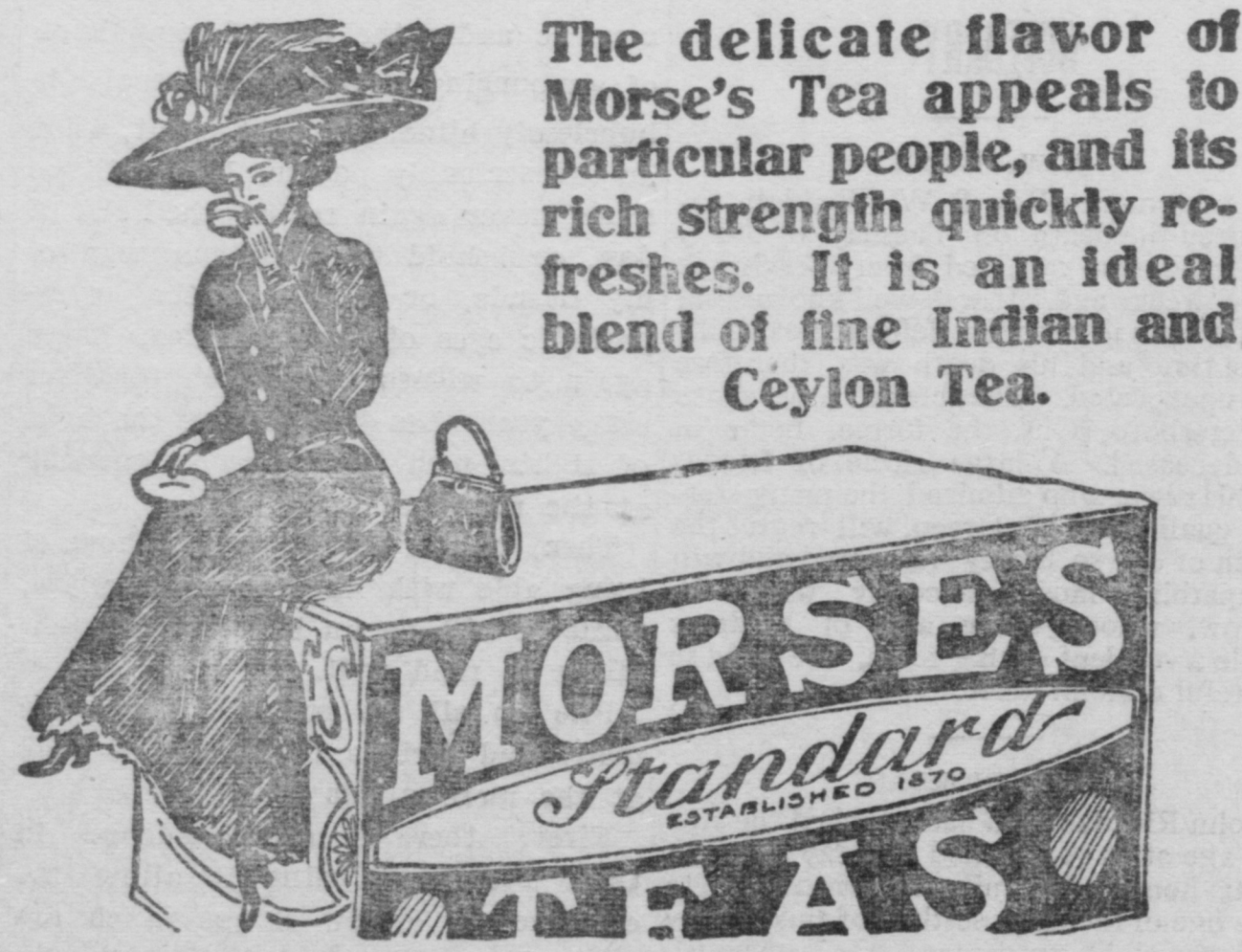

In spite of the high expectations of our contemporary, we take leave to express the doubt that if and when Mr. Borden completes his enforced mission to London, Canada, will be any more "a vital part in the sisterhood of the inter-Imperial nations" than it was before. Mr. Pelletier, Mr. Monk, Mr. Bourassa and Mr. Laverge will see to that. Mr. Borden may wobble many times before he finally evolves his Navy "policy."—Chronicle.

IT SOUNDS ALL RIGHT.

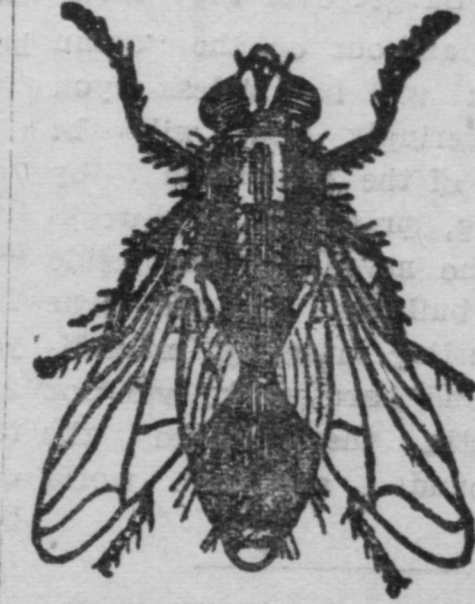
