

## CABLE SHIP MACKAY-BENNETT FINDS BODIES OF TITANIC VICTIMS

CARRYING COFFIN UP GANGPLANK



Sixty-four bodies of victims of the Titanic disaster, which it is believed can be identified, have been recovered by the cable steamship Mackay-Bennett, which went to the scene of the sinking under orders from the White Star line officials to search for bodies and may stay until recalled.

The report of the Mackay-Bennett says that many other bodies were found, but were without marks of identification or in such condition that they were buried at sea. Dense fog, it is said, has delayed the search for the victims by the Mackay-Bennett.

## REVIVALIST RANTON TALKED ON TEMPERANCE QUESTION: WAS BORN IN ST. JOHN.

The Presbyterian church was packed again last evening for Mr. Ranton's temperance lecture, 1,200 tickets had been given out, the full seating and standing capacity of the church, and from the looks of things every ticket had been used. About fifty boys sat with the ministers on the platform for a chorus, and they did good work, too.

The speaker was introduced by Rev. T. Ross Paden who said an introduction was hardly necessary, after these three weeks. He simply wanted to see Angus Hugh Ranton spread himself, like the hen who was trying to hatch thirty eggs.

Mr. Ranton was greeted with hearty applause, as he rose to six feet four inches to begin his address, and there was a good deal of enthusiasm throughout the meeting. The lecturer frequently brought down the house by the humorous stories which he told to illustrate his points.

New Brunswick, 48 years ago. My father was a boiler maker, with a large and growing business, and reputed to be one of the wealthy men of the city, but he was only on the way to be wealthy. My mother died when I was seven years old and my father when I was eight, leaving four children. My grandfather, a Highland Scotchman, brought me to Aurelia, near Toronto. He expected to raise me. The old gentleman raised me to often; I am quite sure he stunted my growth. When ten years of age I ran away to my mother's brother in the country. He said if I would stay and work for him he would pay me wages. I worked for him four months and never got any pay.

My grandfather told me if I would come back he would give me a suit of clothes. One of his own suits was made over for me. My grandfather was not very large north and south, but he was large east and west, and when I got that suit on you couldn't tell whether I was going or coming. The children made so much fun of it that I ran away from school at recess and haven't been back to that school since.

WORKED ON FARM WHEN A BOY.

From twelve years old until I was seventeen I worked for farmers near Barre, going to school for two winters. I also helped in the hotel. At seventeen I decided that I wanted to see more of the world, so I took a job on the Canadian Pacific for big pay. The grub was good, but what I objected to was the sleeping accommodations. Sometimes there were as many as two or three hundred in a bed. I knew I had to scratch for a living but I didn't want to scratch night and day.

WAS BARTENDER IN CANADA.

Then the proprietor of the Selden House, Owen Sound, approached me and asked me if I had ever tended bar. I told him I had a little, as a substitute, so he gave me a job at \$20 a month. I stayed with him for a year, drinking all the time. By the time I was twenty it was reported that I could punish more liquor than any man in the country. Then I left and went back to Barre, and the proprietor of the Victoria hotel

offered me a job to tend bar if I would promise not to drink any myself. I worked there until I was twenty, but I did not keep my vow. Then while in charge of a camp of choppers I went with a company of men into the log church at Ore, where they were having revival meetings.

WAS MADE CONVERT.

I rose for prayer with others and was blessedly converted. I at once began to study and went first into mission work, then into evangelistic work. I never completed my study course and am simply an ordained layman in the Methodist church. I have been preaching and lecturing ever since.

I have done a great deal of lecturing on temperance, taking part in many local option campaigns, and, have a standing offer from the National Anti-Saloon League.

speaking of its social aspects. This has not had a fair discussion. The licensed saloon stands in every city for a certain type of social life. There are scores and hundreds of men, young men in particular, who have no place to go to spend an evening.

The Y. M. C. A., the Christian Endeavor societies and Epworth League are not a substitute for the saloon. For an expenditure of five cents a man can get a place where he can go and smoke, meet his friends for business or pleasure, keep his hat on or take it off, and feel as if he owned the place.

CAN BE SOCIABLE WITHOUT DRINKING.

The saloon in this country is changing its base of appeal, under the guise of being a social institution. It is demanding what can take its place? Men can be sociable without drinking. William Jennings Bryan and William Howard Taft have proved that. We honor such men; we admire them. Young men who are temperate in their sentiments and habits are at a premium today. A certificate of church membership, implying as it does habits of total abstinence, is the best credential a man can carry with him.

Our fight is not with the saloon keeper. Why should it be? You yourselves have put him there. The man who stands behind the bar and sells whiskey is no more worth of being ostracized than the man who stands in front of the bar and drinks it; or the man who rents a building for saloon purposes, or the man who votes to make the thing lawful in his town. As some one said about the bedbug, it is an interesting animal, and a beautiful animal when examined under the microscope; all I've got against it is the way it makes its living.

WHAT THE BREWERS SAY.

At the brewers' convention recently they said "This wave of temperance is rising not receding. To save our business we must see that only clean moral men go into it." That kind of a saloon keeper is a bigger menace than the vile dirty saloon keeper, into whose joint the better class of young men will never go. A relative of mine was arguing with me about the clean saloon he was running. He kept strictly within the legal hours, never sold to minors or drunkards; he never drank himself, his wife and daughter never used liquor, his boys were now studying in the university and never touched it.

But I said to him all that is an argument against the liquor business. What would you think of a dry goods merchant if he and his family never used any dry goods, or a shoe dealer whose family never wore any shoes. If your business is such that you are glad to protect yourself and your family from it, it is not right morally or legally for you to be preying upon others. No amount of license will make it right for you to do to others what you would not do to yourself. If it is right for others to drink, you ought to drink yourself, and your wife and children ought to drink.

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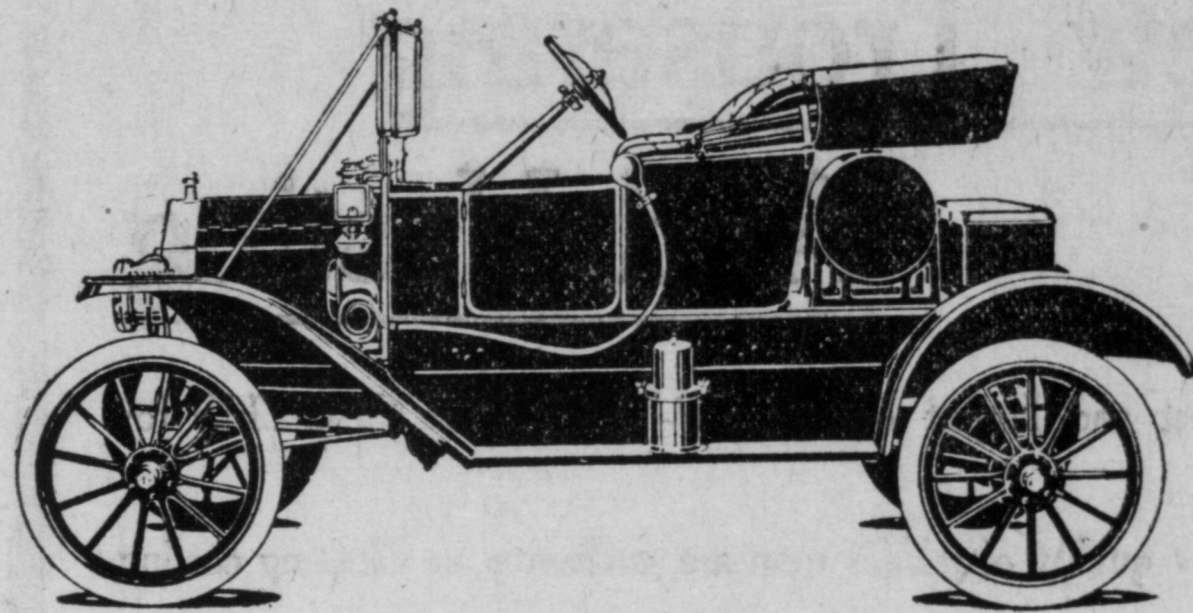
