Will Save the Province From Pernicious Legislation Enacted by the Flemming Government—Business-Like Proposals—Fair Play and Prosperity

If called upon to form a government, I will exert my best efforts to save the province from disastrous effects of the pernicious legislation and agreements enacted and entered into by the administration. Every effort will be directed to giving the province a business-like, prudent and progressive government.

The new administration will inaugurate a policy for the relief and betterment of agriculture.

By introducing legislation with a view to assisting provincial farmers, who lack the necessary capital to bring their lands up to a satisfactory productiveness, such assistance to be by financial and under proper safeguards, by long term loans upon

ers and their sons to remain in the province—

By associating a practical farmer with the administration and direction of the Department of Agriculture—

By abolishing unnecessary offices in the Department of Agriculture so that the appropriations therefor may serve their purpose and no longer be largely wasted in the salaries and travelling expenses of useless officials—

By aiding the establishment of cheap rural telephone services throughout the province.

We will also remove the administration of the roads absolutely from politics, and place the expenditure of the road monies directly in the hands of the people, thereby abolishing the waste of the monies passing through expensive and unnecessary officials.

We will provide for the taxing of school purposes of granted forest lands lying contiguous to school districts (which now escape taxation), thereby improving the schools of remote and depopulated sections, and relieving from the excessive rates the farmers who remain upon the land in the districts.

We will expect in cases of imperative urgency, put up all public works to tender and award the contract therefore to the lowest bidder.

We will provide, in all government contracts, conditions to secure the payment of such wages as generally are accepted as current in each trade for competent workmen in the district where the work is carried out: this to apply to work undertaken by the government which was done by necessary day's work.

We will keep ordinary expenditures of the province within the revenues.

We will undertake a re-survey and valuation of the Crown lands of the province and to provide for the conservation of our forest revenue under the direction of scientific foresters.

We will promote and encourage the

colonization and settlement of the Crown lands, which are adapted to agriculture.

We will amend the mining laws of the province in the interests of bona fide development, and to prevent the holding of mineral areas by speculators.

We will not allow any legislation or departmental regulation to interfere with the customary privileges of the fishermen respecting the oysters, clam and quahaug beds along our shores, or support the creation of any monopoly in such oyster, clam or quahaug fisheries to the injury of the small fishermen.

We will introduce legislation to set aside certain streams, lakes and rivers wherein the residents of this province, upon the payment of a nominal license fee and subject to proper regulations, may have the right to fish.

We will give careful attention to the development of the various water powers of the province under government control with a view to transmitting and supplying electricity at actual cost to manufacturers, farmers and others who might, with advantage, use this modern source of heat and power.

We will no longer permit the granting of these valuable water power and franchises to companies for the purpose of private speculation, to be held for gain against bona fide manufacturing interests seeking cheap power.

Upon this Platform, and my criticism of the administration, I confidently appeal for your support.

PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT IS HONEYCOMBED WITH DECEIT

Glaring Instances Which Deprive Flemming Administration of any Right to People's Support—A New Government Needed in This Province

(Moncton Transcript.)

The Hazen-Flemming government came into power, pledged to honest administration of provincial affairs. But it has not fulfilled its pledges. Its career has been marked by the most flagrant violations of ordinary business honesty. It has turned over valuable provincial franchises to private corporations for a mere song, selling the people's birthright for a mess of pottage. It has allowed its heeled to take astonishing tolls of the public money, voted for the highways, bridges and other public services.

Messrs. Hazen and Flemming promised to keep the expenditures within the bounds of the revenues. But they have not done so. They professed to be greatly alarmed at the increase of the public debt, under the old governments, and pledged themselves to make a better showing in this respect. But they have not fulfilled this pledge; since they assumed power the public debt has increased at an unprecedented rate.

They went about the province prior to the elections of 1908 talking loud-

ly of fraud and corruption in connection with the administration of the Central Railway. After their election to office they appointed a commission to probe the affairs of the railway. The commission, composed of Tory partisans brought in a report, making serious charges, against Mr. Pugsley. If the report was justified by the evidence, the government's duty was plain. But the government took no action; it merely filed the report and handed over a considerable sum of public money to Mr. Powell and his colleagues. The government was certainly not honest in this matter, it either birked its responsibility and connived at crime, or it gave publicity to a false report, knowing it to be false. Its failure to take action on the report can only be accounted for by the supposition that it was well aware that there was no foundation for the charges contained in the report.

Mr. Flemming boasts much about the honest collection of territorial revenues. Just why he and his supporters consider it a tremendous virtue to honestly collect the revenues is rather hard to see; one would not think much of a business man who went about boasting of his honesty. But it seems hardly necessary for Mr. Flemming to try to emphasize the honesty of his government by the contention that there is no more lumber cut on crown lands now than in 1907; a contention which involves the admission that for three years his government did not make an honest collection of the stumpage dues. Such a contention only emphasizes his indifference to the truth.

The whole administration is honeycombed with deception. Its members have been so intent on deceiving the public that they have lost all sense of perspective, and apparently even deceive themselves. Addressing a temperance delegation some time ago Mr. Flemming claimed credit for the passage of an act adopted when the old government was in power. Addressing the legislature during the recent session, Dr. Landry made a score of statements diametrically opposed to the information contained in the annual report of his department signed and approved by himself.

If honesty is an essential qualification in a government and its members, then we assuredly need a new government in this province.

The Liberals will build the Valley Railway all the way to Grand Falls, as part of the Intercolonial system.

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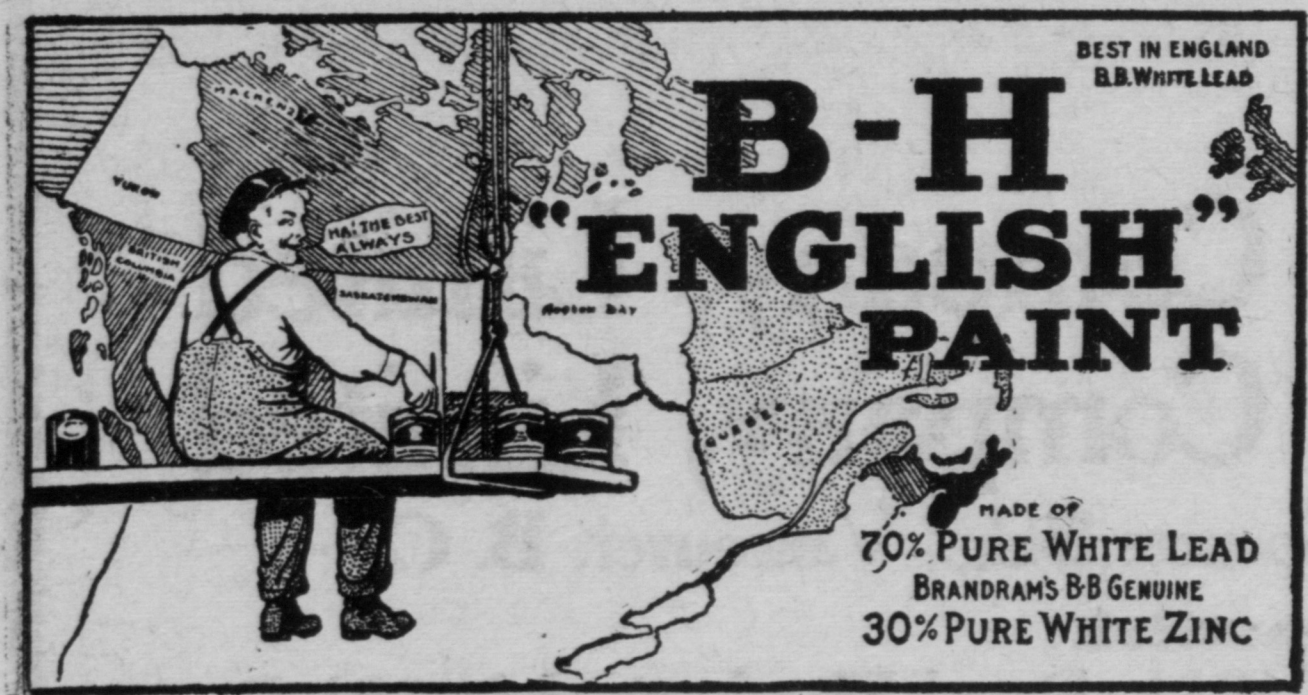
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
