

He must also have been aware that the reciprocity act urged by him did not prevent Canada from prohibiting the expor-

tation to the United States of pulp wood from the lands controlled by the Dominion govarnment.

Under this act to admit free paper and pulp Canadian capitalists are purchasing large amounts of Maine timberlands in Aroostook county planning to float this lumber from the timberlands situated on the A; legash, Aroostook and St. Jahn rivers to the pulp and paper mills of New Brunswick to be manufactured and then to be shipped back to the states free of duty, thus taking from us a supply of natural resources that our people have a right this side of the border by the pulp
