## TWENTY YEARS AGO

From the Sentinel  
September 10th, 1892

## ASPHALT

On Tuesday the first asphalt pavement ever laid in Woodstock was put down. Side walks in two districts in Wellington Ward and one in King's Ward are the first to be so treated. In Wellington Ward, the sections to be asphalted are the sidewalk extending from Park street, to the entrance of the graveyard, on the west side of Broadway, and the other on the east side of Main street from Connell's Iron Works to the old depot. On the first named section, the work has been begun. The section to be asphalted in King's Ward is the eastern side of Main street, from the corner of Guelph street up to James Hayden's. These are important and much travelled sections.

This work is an experiment here, strange to say, in this instance, our town not leading the other provincial towns in the "development of Progress." This experiment is one justified by experience elsewhere and will, it is claimed, prove a saving as, of course, in every other respect it will be more satisfactory than former modes of making sidewalks.

The asphaltting is being done under the management of G. W. Fisher & Co., St. John. Charles Trafton is conducting the grading necessary preparatory to placing the asphalt.

John Barry, an employee on the Sentinel staff, left on Monday evening for Brockton, Mass., to attend the funeral of his father, David Barry, whose death occurred on the morning of the 5th inst. The deceased was a long time resident of Woodstock.

## LAWN TENNIS

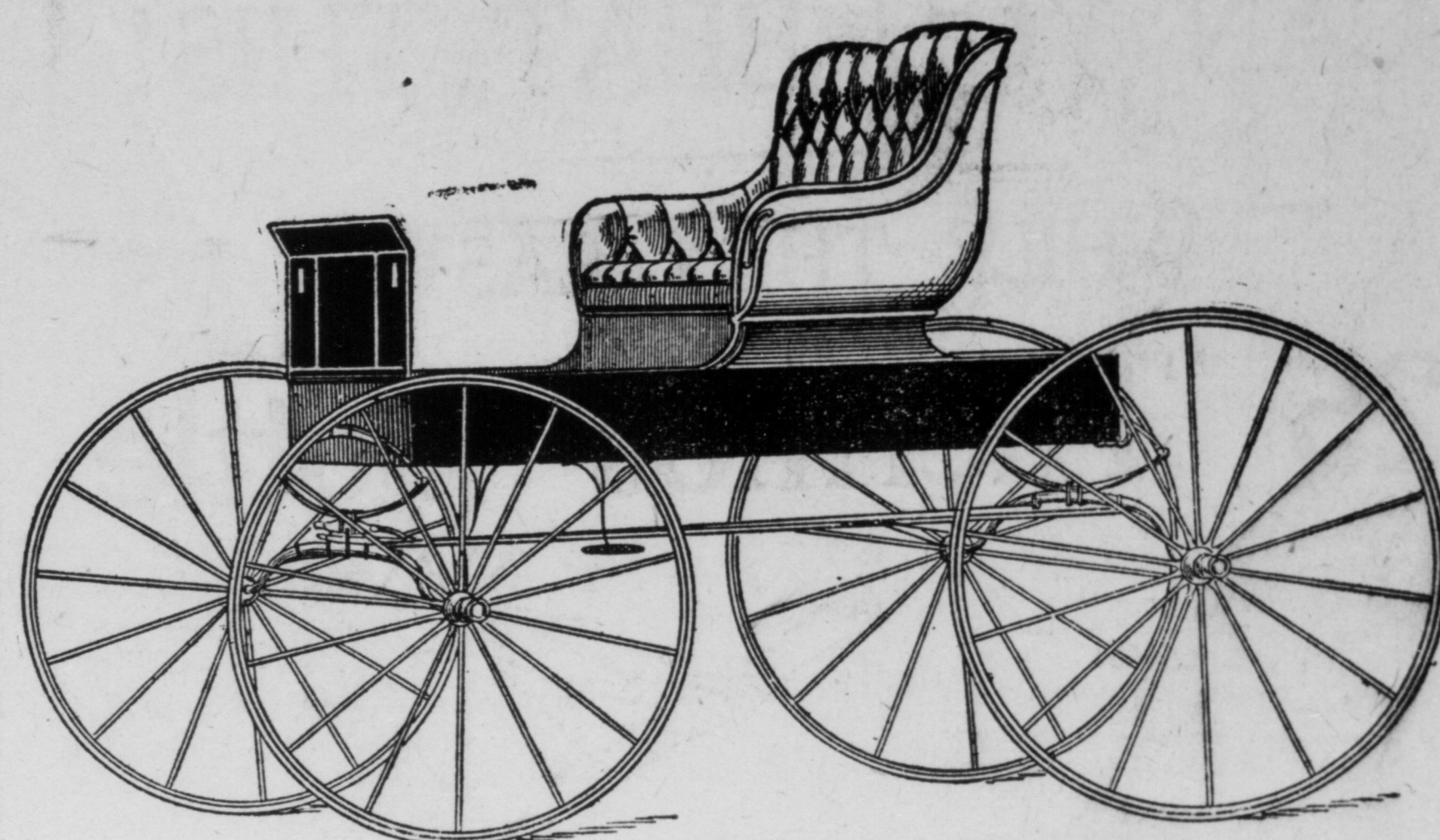
