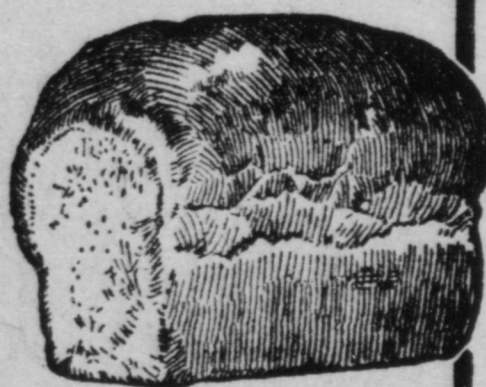


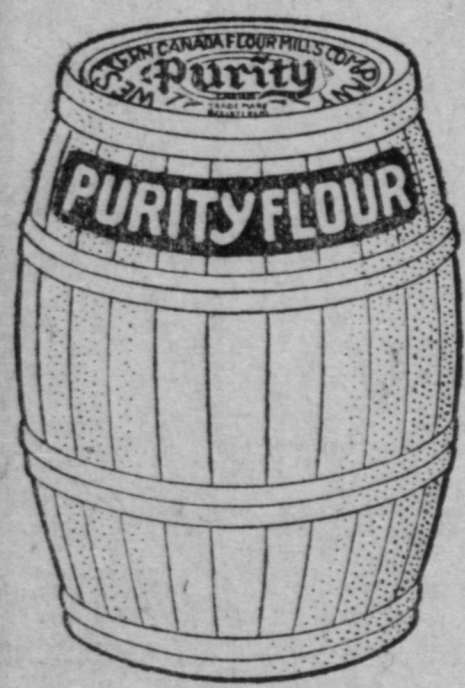

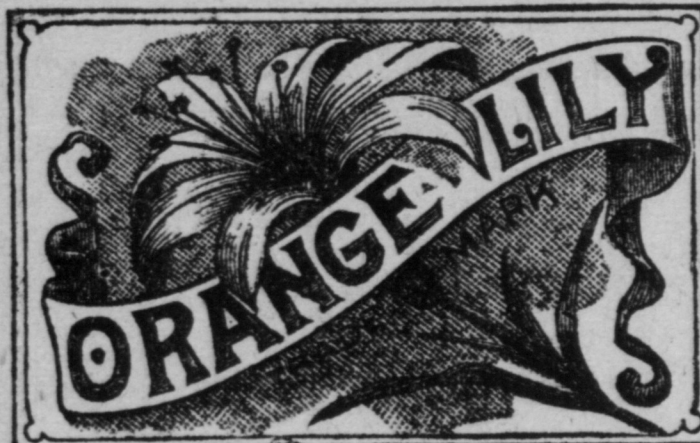

NORTH SHORE EXERCISED OVER DOHERTY VERDICT

Public Meeting Tonight in Campbellton as Protest Against it—Crown Course Criticised

The recent verdict of a Campbellton jury, acquitting Doctor Doherty, who had caused the death of D. J. Bruce, has been followed by a storm of protest. The Campbellton Graphic, which denounced the verdict in a former issue prints the following in its issue of last Friday:—

"His Worship Mayor Murray in capacity of first citizen of the town has convened a public meeting to be held on Monday, the 29th inst., in the Opera House. This meeting will be in the nature of a public protest against the recent verdict in the Doherty case and it is probable that further action may be the outcome of this gathering. Already steps have been taken which show the trend of popular opinion on this subject and already one town on the North Shore has had an indignation meeting and will send a petition to the lieutenant governor. The stigma which remains on Restigouche county must be removed, and it appears that united action will be taken backed by the public bodies which should go a long way towards clearing away this terrible injustice."

Thos. P. Drumma, in a long letter to the Graphic, says:—

"Most of our citizens feel that an investigation should be called for at once and an opportunity will be given them shortly to express their feelings and desires. It is felt that the crown representative did not have sufficient information to enable him to properly deal with the case. Arriving the day before the trial, how could he be expected to have a mastery of all the details or to have sufficient knowledge of the jurymen to make any objections. Against him there was Mr. Powell, one of the ablest lawyers in this part of the dominion, and this gentleman had been over the ground carefully, he had been present at the preliminary hearings—why was the town representative not on the case from the commencement? I know that a representative of the crown was present but why was the same lawyer not retained all through the proceedings?"

The Chatham News says:—
"Two of the jurymen who astounded the public by a verdict of not guilty in the Doherty murder trial have publicly apologized by explaining that they simply meant not guilty of murder, and did not know that their verdict would set the prisoner free. Their minds were confused by the multiplicity of words from counsel and judge. It was the rankest verdict—directly contrary to the evidence—that ever disgraced a New Brunswick court."

On virgin soils the practice is almost universal of pasturing the wheat itself while the plants are young.

Do not change the feed suddenly. Feed liberally, and use only fresh, palatable feedstuffs; in no case should decomposed or mouldy material be used.

Remember that horses which are being highly fed and fitted for sale are more susceptible to thrush than those on a more scanty diet. It is necessary to take greater precaution in keeping the animals' feet clean and dry.
