



Andover, N. B., July 26-A shocking fatality occurred at Tilley, near here, on Thursday when Gordon, the twelve year old son of Joseph Paris, died from a bullet wound in the heart received from the rifle of a companion. The accident happened about noon Thursday. Young Paris together with a couple of companions of about his own age were playing near his home in Tilley. One of the lads, Ernest Morrill, had a rifle; the gun exploded and the bullet struck the Paris boy near the heart, killing him almost in stantly.
