

HIS OWN MEDICINE PROVES DISTASTEFUL

Dr. Edwards Flies Into Rage at Mr. Carvell's Rebuke—Accused Sir Wilfrid of Being Disloyal

Carleton Liberal, in Absence of His Leader Scores Frontenac Member

OTTAWA, April 18th.—Stinging straight-fung statements directed by Mr. Frank Carvell to Dr. Edwards, the member for Frontenac, who so far forgot Parliamentary decency and ethics as to accuse Sir Wilfrid Laurier of disloyalty, after the Liberal leader had left the Chamber at 3 o'clock this morning, sent the Frontenac man into a wild passion of uncontrolled anger, in which he transgressed all Parliamentary rules and screamed the word "lied" across the floor of the House.

The Customs estimates were under consideration, and Hon. Dr. Pugsley had been reviewing the case of the dismissal of Customs Collector Baldwin at Coaticook for writing a letter to the press condemning the disloyal declarations of the Nationalists, and calling upon both Liberals and Conservatives to lay aside party politics and condemn such utterances. Dr. Edwards retorted by alleging that years ago Sir Wilfrid Laurier was guilty of sentiments that were disloyal in the extreme.

MR. CARVELL'S STINGING CASTIGATION.

The Liberal Chief had just left the Chamber, and there was an indignant protest from the Liberal benches. Mr. Carvell rose and chastised the Frontenac member. "This comes," he declared in his direct way, "from the man who accepts a gold watch from the postmasters and mail carriers in his constituency. This is the man who talks about the dignity and loyalty of members! This is the man who turns traitor—I will withdraw the word if he thinks it too strong—on his own Minister of Justice."

"I want that word withdrawn," shouted Dr. Edwards. "Certainly," replied Mr. Carvell. "I knew he would object to it. A man like my hon. friend always whines when you tell him the truth. I expected he would raise a row about it."

"Withdraw," repeated Dr. Edwards.

COULD PROVE BY THE RECORDS "Yes," replied Mr. Carvell, "I will withdraw. I will say he always cries like a baby. It is the same thing. He is the man who was put up to ask the question as to who was to be warden of Kingston Penitentiary, the man who tried to work up a creed of prejudice against the Minister of Justice. I can prove these things by the records of the House."

"It's not true! Withdraw! Withdraw!" Dr. Edwards continued shouting.

"I am not surprised that my hon. friend gets ugly over this. One would expect him to get ugly."

"I emphatically deny it," called Dr. Edwards, white with anger.

"The member for Carleton has made a false statement," again shouted Edwards.
