

Hamburg, Jan. 8.-The Hamburg-American Company's new liner Imperator will sail on May 7 on her maiden voyage to New York.

The Imperator is the largest liner in the world.

She is an eleven story floating palace 909 feet long with engines o 80,000 horsepower. Her displacement is 50,000 tons and she can accommodate 5,000 passengers. Among other features the Imperator is fitted with three electric elevators, winter garden, summer house a theatre, gymnasium, a ritz restaurant, swimming baths, a ball room, telephone and a cottage cafe. The first class dining saloon is in the Louis XVI style. It is 300 feet long.
