

Mr. Hanna's message to Secretary Bryan was despatched today from Monterey. The Secretary took it to the White House at once and it was the subject of a long conference between him and President Wilson.

Another list being distributed is that of Mexicans managing some of the American stores. It is declared thes men must be killed because of their identification with foreign in-

The newspapers of the capital are publishing stories to the effect that the American forces at Vera Cruz are slaughtering women and children and the papers call on Mexicans to retaliate in a similar manner.
