Mrs. Belle S. Miles, Pioneer of State, Dead

Helena, March, 14th, 1914.—Mrs. Belle S. Miles, who had lived in the state since 1868, died here yesterday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. W. C. Almon. Mrs. Miles lived in Butte until 10 years ago, when she removed to Helena to live with her daughter. She was 70 years old.

Her birthplace was Richmond, New Brunswick, and she reached Montana via Corinne, Utah, and for years lived in Silver Bow county near Butte, where her late husband was engaged in the sheep business. She was a member of the Episcopal church and services were held today at Mrs. Almon's home at Helena, Rev. F. R. Bateman officiating, and the funeral will be held this afternoon at Butte, the body being brought there, on the afternoon train.

Besides Mrs. Almon the deceased is survived by a son, C. L. Miles of San Francisco; a sister, Mrs. L. M. Bull of Houlton, Me.; three brothers, John A. McIntyre of Houlton, Robt. of Boston, and Andrew McIntyre of California, and a brother-in-law, C. L. Miles of Calgary, who came to Helena yesterday to visit Mrs. Miles and found her dead.

Federal League Will Sue Players for \$65,000

BLANDING KILLIFER AND KAHLER FOR \$15,000 EACH AND WILLIAM AND BAUMGARTNER OF \$10,000 EACH.

Chicago, April 15.—Suits for damages aggregating \$65,000 will be begun in a few days by the Federal League against five ball players who, it will be claimed, refused to live up to their contracts with its clubs. This was announced by Pres. Gilmore on his return today from the Eastern cities of the Federal circuit.

Blanding, Killifer and Kahler, will be sued for \$15,000 each, and Williams and Baumgartner for \$10,000 each, he said.

Gilmore said that while he was in Baltimore three members of the New York Nationals called on him and said they were willing to play in the Federal League if offered inducements they like. He promised to take them on if any of his clubs want them. He refused to make public their names.

Paris, April 15.—Jack Johnson, the negro pugilist, intends to return to Chicago for the retrial of the charges against him under the Mann Act. He today authorized his Paris representative to say that after his fight with Frank Moran he would sail for America and place himself at the disposition of the court.

Boston, Mass., April 20.—James Duffy, the great Hamilton, Ont., runner, today captured the classic twenty-five mile Boston Marathon race from a representative field of American runners.

Ed. Fabre, of Montreal, ran second to Duffy, close behind him.

Duffy has been running for some time, although he has never entered the B. A. A. run before. The last race in which Duffy ran was a 10-mile cross-country, in which he finished first, covering the distance in 53 m. 21 s. This happened but a little more than a week ago.

It is announced that the professional baseball league proposal for the Maritime Provinces is all off, so far as Halifax is concerned. 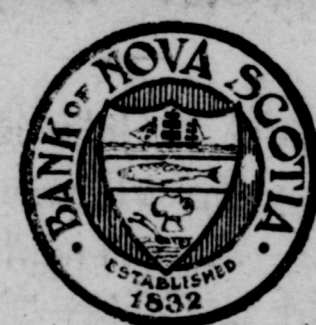
At Bristol, N. B., Monday night, April 6th, Mrs. John Mead, died of pneumonia following measles, after an illness of only a few days.
