PERLEY C. BROWN SUICIDES

At Presque Isle Saturday Afternoon—County Attorney of Aroostook—Despondent from Poor Health

Perley C. Brown, a promising young lawyer of Presque Isle and the county attorney of Aroostook, serving his second term, shot himself in his office at 3.30 Saturday afternoon, January 10, the top of his head being blown off. He had been in poor health the past few months from nervousness caused by overwork and anxiety, and was doubtless suffering under a temporary aberration of mind when he committed his rash act.

Mr. Brown had been very despondent for some time, and had more than once mentioned suicide as a possible way out of his troubles. The 32-caliber rifle with which the suicide was accomplished was purchased by him only two days before—apparently with its final use in his mind at the time.

At the November term of court County Attorney Brown had charge of numerous important cases. The trial of Rev. Charles N. Emelius of New Sweden, in 1912, charged with the murdering of his father-in-law, Mr. Jacobson, was his most important criminal case in this being assisted by his father-in-law, Hon. Wm R. Pattangall, then attorney general for Maine.

That the unfortunate young man feared the oncoming of insanity is shown by the following hasty note, evidently written just before his death:—

"I am going hopelessly insane and rather than be a burden on my people and suffer for a long lifetime in an asylum, I would rather be dead. Miss Gilman knows all about my business."

"Perley C. Brown."

The Miss Gilman mentioned was his stenographer.

The funeral took place at 2:00 o'clock Tuesday afternoon, the attendance being large indeed. The services were in charge of Trinity Lodge, No. 130, Free and Accepted Masons.

The deceased was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Woodford Brown, respected citizens of Presque Isle. He was himself much loved and respected, and his untimely death casts a shadow over the whole community.

Mr. Brown leaves a wife, who was Miss Katherine Pattangall, to mourn the loss of a most considerate and affectionate husband.

Maple Nut Delight—Place in a saucepan one cupful of maple sugar, one cupful light brown sugar, and one-half cupful of water and a pinch cream of tartar. Boil to the hard ball stage; then stir in one cupful of chopped nut meats and one teaspoonful of vanilla, although this latter can be omitted. Pour this mixture over the stiffly beaten whites of two eggs and beat up until light and foamy. Drop from a teaspoon on to paraffin paper, and press a half nut meat on top of each while the candy is still soft.

FOR A TOWN MANAGER

Norwood, Mass., Jan. 18.—At a special town meeting in Everett Hall the report of the town charter committee, embodying a synopsis of the

proposed changes in town government, was presented. A bill embodying the changes will be before the legislature.

The plan provides for an unpaid board of five selectmen, to serve three years, alternation in election being provided for; an elected unpaid finance commission of three, to serve three years which shall make up the annual budget of the town, and a board of three assessors to be appointed by the selectmen.

The selectmen shall act as overseers of the poor and supervisors of highways, as at present, and shall also take over the powers and duties of the water, sewer, park and municipal light commissioners and tree warden, and those offices shall be abolished.

The plan provides for a general town manager, who shall be the administrative head of all departments of the town and shall purchase supplies, except books for the public library and schools, hire and discharge assistants and employees, have charge of the police department, and act in an advisory capacity to the selectmen. He shall be appointed by the selectmen and be removed at their will.
