TWEEDIE HINTS AT RE-ENTERING PUBLIC LIFE

Ex-Governor, at Montreal, Says He May Lead Local Opposition. Has Been Asked to Take The Reins—Former Premier Says That Liberals Will Win Next Election, But Task for New Government Would be Hard Owing to Extravagance of Present Regime

(Canadian Press)

Montreal, March 30—It is more than probable that Hon. L. J. Tweedie, formerly prime minister of New Brunswick and lieutenant-governor of that province, will re-enter public life and lead the Liberal opposition forces at the coming provincial elections in that province.

Hon. Mr. Tweedie, who was in Montreal today on his way home from Hamilton, accompanied by Mrs. Tweedie, was asked if he did not intend to re-enter active public life. He replied that the party wanted him to do so, but that the way things were going in New Brunswick it might be hard for a man to take charge of affairs and conduct them on economical and conservative lines as he would constantly be confronted with the cry: "Look what the other fellows have done."

"But being in opposition, your responsibility will be lessened," said the interviewer.

"I will not be in opposition, as we would win," said Mr. Tweedie.

"There would be no doubt on the score."

Further than this Mr. Tweedie would say nothing, but the indications are that he will again become a leading factor in the public life of New Brunswick.

here and after a time buy the other company, will you raise the rates?" Mr. Gould—"We will guarantee OUR rates will not be higher. I cannot vouch for rates of subsidiary company, as to what they will charge consumer."

Mr. Carvell—"What do they charge consumer in other towns?"

Mr. Gould—"They practically pay 9 cents. We want to get an auxiliary line to Houlton, where a line is needed in case of accident."

Mr. Carvell—"What do you charge say 50 H. P.?"

Mr. Gould—"About 2 cents."

Mr. Carvell—"We are delivering it direct for one cent. In case of the town contract instead of paying \$2500 they would pay Mr. Gould \$5000 at his prices."

Mr. Gould—"We don't want this business."

Mr. Hayden—"We are citizens of the town and have never asked the town for assistance or exemptions. There are no complaints about our service. We pay heavy taxes and we feel we have a right to be protected. If this company comes in we will have to put up with it."

F. B. Carvell—"We perhaps feel a little strong about this \$150,000 we have invested in cold cash. Our taxes have always been paid, we have not asked for a bonus and don't want it. As we have made this venture go we naturally are entitled to some protection. If you analyze Mr. Gould's statement he has nothing to offer of any moment. The company can come in here if this council give them the authority. If the council says No, they can't come. Mr. Gould wants to furnish power to the small towns—which is very laudable—but if he only wants to get to Houlton, why need he come here to do so? We take the broad ground that as a town council you should protect us. We are paying our taxes—and every member of the company is paying his taxes and DO NOT HAVE TO BE SUEDE EITHER. We pay what we are assessed. Mr. Gould assumes that we have not enough power. If he will give us the names of the parties requiring power we will furnish it. Who wants this power? We have 200

H. P. to sell and we are furnishing all power asked for. In some cases at \$750, a year and 1 1/2 cents a Kilowatt. Let me make this statement: We hear around the streets and on the trains that Connell Bros. went to pieces because we wanted too much for power. 

TO PROBE COST OF PINDER'S ROAD

Borden Government Appoints R. A. Pringle of Ottawa to Inquire Into Charges of F. B. Carvell and Admissions of H. F. McLeod in Parliament

Ottawa, March 30—The government has appointed R. A. Pringle, K.C., of Ottawa, to hold an investigation into the charges made some time ago in the commons by Mr. Carvell, in relation to the Southampton Railway in New Brunswick, and the allegation that the road had been built out of government subsidies which \$26,000 left over for private profit.

The announcement was made by the acting minister of railways, Hon. Dr. Reid, during the course of Hon. Frank Oliver's speech this afternoon. Mr. Oliver pointed out that under the Liberal government a great work
