Fredericton, Dec. 22—Lieut. C. W. Clarke of the 71st Regiment, who went to Salisbury Plain with the first contingent arrived home last night somewhat disappointed at his

failure to get a place in the second contingent but confident he will yet get to the front. He said that a report that Canadians had been offered places in Earl Kitchener's army was not strictly accurate. Several did apply for commissions and were promptly queried as to the size of their incomes. When told that they had none they were advised to wait for a chance with the Canadian contingent.

Colonel Kirkpatrick, of Woodstock, who returned with the surplus officers has been offered command of a new battalion of infantry to be organized in the maritime provinces and will accept it. It may be mobilized in Amherst.
