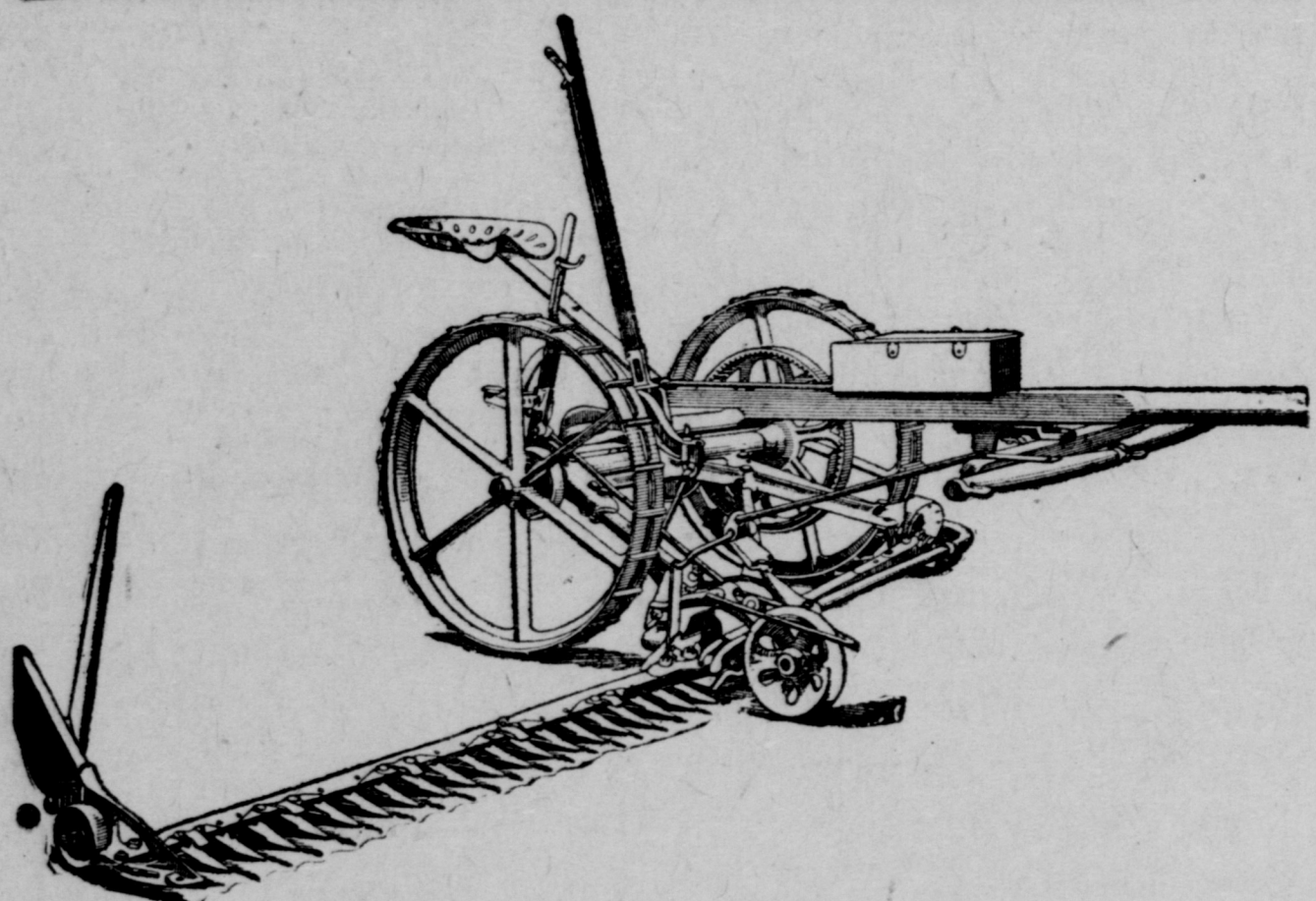

MORE TORY SCANDALS LEAK OUT

Graft Exposures Promised
When Maritime Province
Expenditures are Investigated This Coming Session
—One Minister Caught—
Revelations in New Brunswick but Small Part of What is Promised When Public Accounts are Produced

MONTREAL, July 24—According to well-defined and authoritative reports in Liberal circles here, the present sensational exposures of graft under the Conservative regime in New Brunswick are to be followed at the next session of the Federal Parliament by further exposures bringing the trail "higher up" and connecting the Federal Government with gross dishonesty and graft in the spending of money on public works and other Federal undertakings in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. It is understood that ample evidence is in the hands of the Liberal leaders to make things decidedly interesting for some of the Federal Ministers when the Public Accounts Committee gets busy next session.

The matter was discussed at a meeting of Liberal leaders here last week at the call of Sir Wilfrid Laurier. The details are not yet available for publication, but the names of members of Parliament and of, at least, one Minister are freely mentioned, while the minor politicians who concern themselves about dredging contracts and the construction of public works figure in surprising numbers in the stories that are told of the doings of the Tory faithful in New Brunswick since their friends attained power.

GRAVE SCANDALS.

If even a fraction of what is reported be true, there have been grave scandals in connection with Maritime public works. It is asserted that contracts have been awarded to political friends of the Administration at Ottawa without tender or public competition; that in at least one case, in which a contract was taken out of the hands of the successful tenderer, the terms of the original contract have been varied by Orders-in-Council for the benefit of the Tory politicians to whom the work was given without competition; that prior to tender being sent up to the Government for certain Maritime work prospective bidders have been asked, in the event of their tenders being the lowest, to retire in favor of specially favored friends of the Ministers, whose names were mentioned; and that after contracts have been secured in public competition by competent contractors such pressure has been brought to bear upon them that they have been forced to retire.

MORE "PICKINGS."

All the public works affected by these tactics are being carried on at a greatly increased cost to the country.

try. It is only a matter of time when all public works were in charge of the Department of Public Works and Railways and Canals that is no longer the case, and that the Departments of Marine and Fisheries and of the Militia and Defence during the last three years have been extending their operations into the field of construction until they now have extensive contracts under way which provide additional "pickings" for the politician.

It is stated that there will be an exhaustive inquiry next session of a score of scandals in connection with the expenditure of public money in the Maritime Provinces. The Senate which still has a Liberal majority which can obviate any burking of an investigation in the Commons may hold an inquiry on its own account. In fact it is asserted that this will be done, even if a general election is held in the meantime, as the present complexion of the Senate will not be changed for several years to come, and the Government cannot, therefore, escape from their difficulties by a premature dissolution.

A GRAND FALLS CASE.

Application was made before Mr. Justice White in the Supreme Court Chancery Division Wednesday morning in behalf of the plaintiff in the suit of Bridget M. Curley et al. vs. William A. Curley, to restrain the defendant from interfering with the plaintiffs' use and possession of certain lots at Grand Falls, to which both parties claim title. After the application had been heard, it was decided by consent that the defendant should not interfere with the plaintiffs' use of the lots, except that the defendant should have possession of the dwelling, and it was further agreed that the cause should be tried at an early date. The question of costs was reserved. J. F. H. Teed appeared for the plaintiff and J. B. M. Baxter, K. C., for the defendant.
