LIBERALS PAY HOMAGE TO THEIR GREAT CHIEF

Express Loyalty and Affection to Sir Wilfrid Laurier on Anniversary Occasion--Forty Years in Public Service

Ottawa, May 28—"May I give you, Besides Liberal members of the my good friends, this one word, Senate and House of Commons there cannot always expect to win,—that were present a large number of ladies and personal friends, and the purpose should be, not mere winning, but seeing to it that we have the best cause. I am not indifferent to success, but still success is not the main object. Our obligation is to fight for truth and justice, as God gives us to see truth and justice. And truth and justice will prevail in the end—perhaps," with a smile, "next time."

So spoke Sir Wilfrid Laurier to his friends and followers in the Commons chamber this afternoon shortly before the House formally resumed its business. The Liberal Chief was manifestly moved and the enthusiastic cheering which greeted his words bespoke the spirit of the gathering. The occasion was the commemoration of the advent of young Wilfrid Laurier forty years ago to Canada's Parliament, and the presentation to the great Liberal Leader of a \$600 gold watch and chain and to Lady Laurier of a purse of gold by colleagues and followers in the Senate and Commons.

LADY LAURIER HONORED

Senator Hewitt Bostock, Liberal leader in the Senate, made the presentation. He referred to the deep appreciation felt by the Liberal Party of the forty years of distinguished public service with Sir Wilfrid had rendered his country. "At an Englishman," observed Hon. Mr. Bostock "I may say that Englishmen at home are perhaps better able to realize your great services to the country than even the people of Canada. You have done more than any other Canadian to give Canada her place in the world and your example is an inspiration to those who devotedly follow you." Senator Bostock also referred in a happy vein to the great indebtedness of all to Lady Laurier.

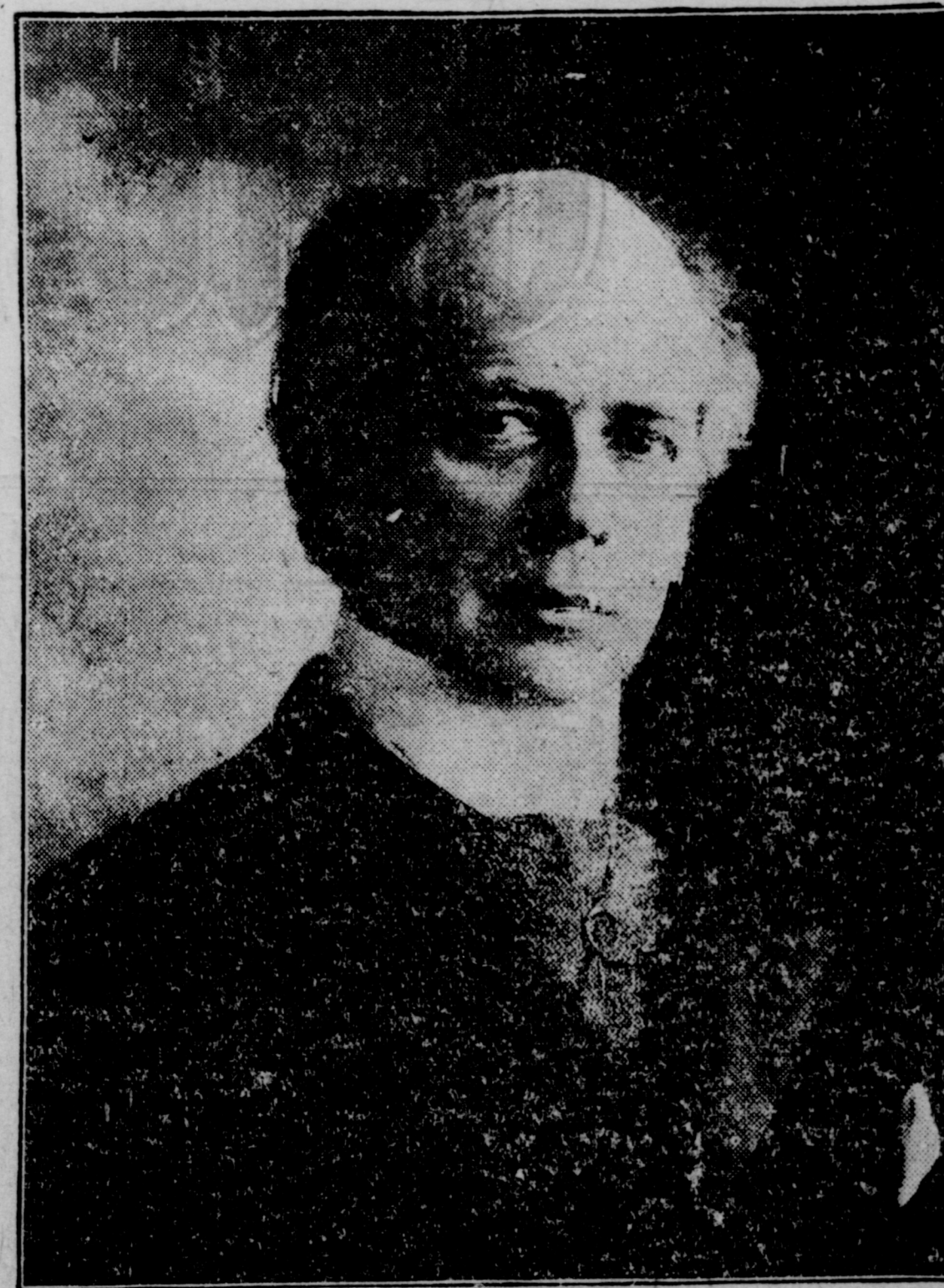
