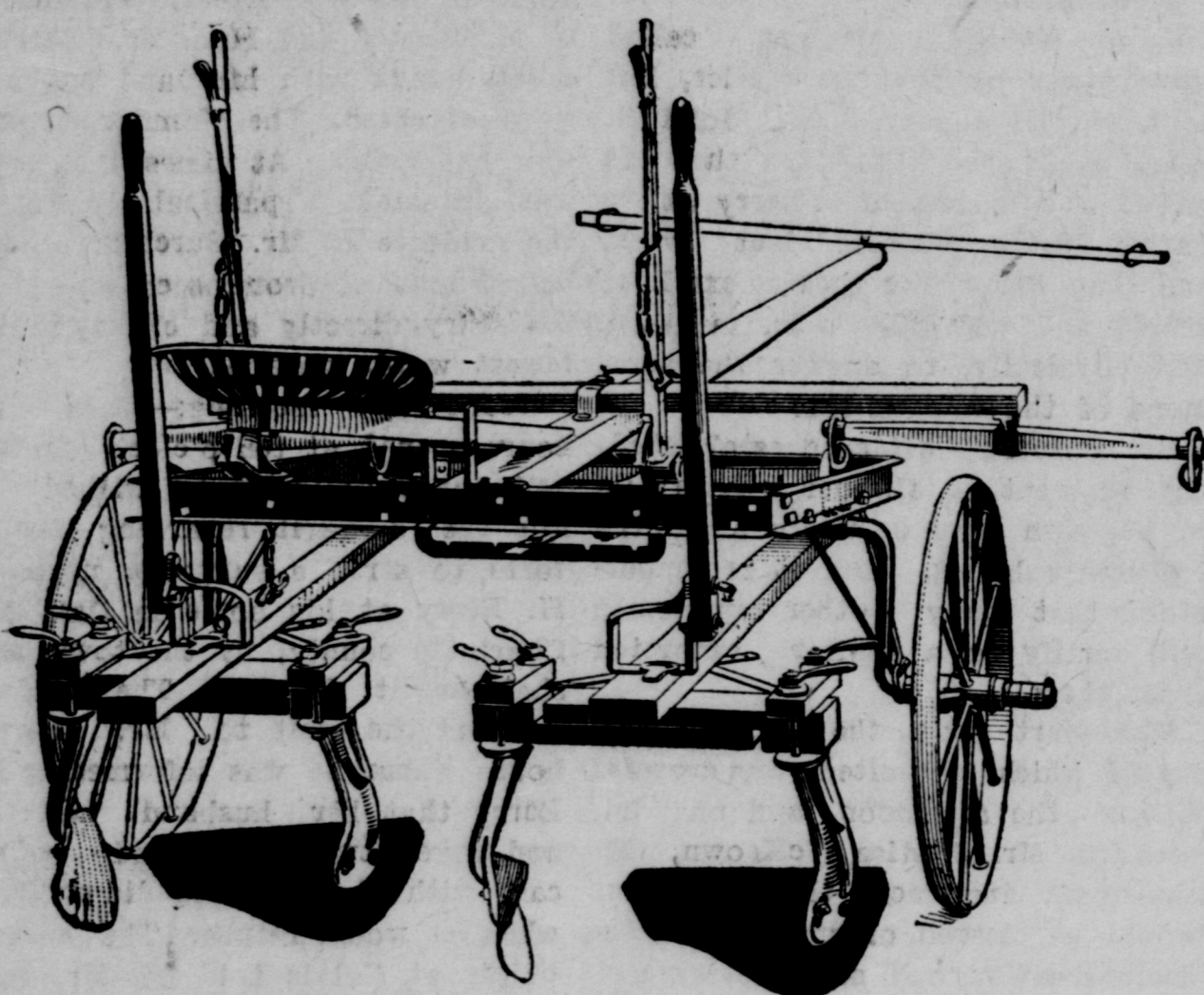

"NO TRUCK OR TRADE."

The Tory Party came into office in Canada as exponents of the cry, "No Truck or Trade with the Yankees." It was folly, they shouted, for Canadians to talk about exporting food products to the United States for that country was a large exporter of such products itself. The results of the Underwood Tariff have shown the value of the American market to Canadian producers so conclusively that little is now heard of that phase of the question. It is useless for the Tory organs to take issue with cold, hard facts as revealed in the official trade figures issued by the Borden Government itself. Every intelligent Canadian knows that there has been a phenomenal increase in the export of certain Canadian products to the United States since the removal or lowering of the duties thereon under the new Democratic tariff and that the American market offers practically unlimited possibilities for the producers of this country.

In a review of the export trade of the United States during the past year, recently issued by the United States Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, there are many facts which are interesting to Canadians. It shows that there is a rapid decline in the export of foodstuffs by that country. Wheat exports, which amounted to 186 million bushels in 1900, 216 million in 1901, and 235 million in 1902 were but 87 million in 1910, 69 million in 1911, and 80 million in 1912, while the unusual large crop of 1912 permitted an exportation of 143 million in 1913, all of these figures including flour in terms of wheat. In meats the decline, when stated in values, has not been as distinctly perceptible, except in fresh beef exports, owing to the fact that prices have sharply advanced. In fresh beef, which until recently formed an important item in this group, the decline has been very rapid, the total quantity of fresh beef exported in 1913 having been but 71.3 million pounds, against 255 million in 1903 and 329 million in 1900.

Twelve principal countries of the world form the market for four-fifths of the United States, principally manufactured goods, namely the United Kingdom, Canada, Germany, France, Netherlands, Italy, Cuba, Belgium, Japan, Mexico, Argentina and Brazil. To the United Kingdom alone the exports in 1913 amounted to 597 million dollars, or practically one-fourth of the grand total of 2,466 million exported in that year; to Canada, 415 million dollars, or practically one-sixth of the total, and to all British territory, including Great Britain and her colonies, 1,134 million dollars, or 46 per cent. of the total exports.

Thus, under a Government pledged to "no truck or trade," Canada is buying over a million dollars worth of goods every day of the year from the United States. It is shockingly "disloyal" of course, and we must be rapidly becoming the merest kind of an "adjunct" according to the Tory doctrine!

TO CLEAN COMBS AND BRUSHES.

Brushes of all descriptions and combs may be quickly and thoroughly cleaned in gasoline. Wash as you would in water, then rinse with clean gasoline and put them where they can air. The odor disappears quickly and the bristles of the brushes are more like new than when washed in soap and water.

The gasoline remaining may be strained through cheesecloth into a sealing jar or can be allowed to settle and later poured off and used again for the same purpose.

The Girl at the Washtboard

The recent graduation exercises of the Minnesota School of Agriculture included one number which the newspapers reported with the sensational headline: "The Girl at the Washtboard." One of the girl graduates as her share in the programme demonstrated the laundering of soiled clothes. She slipped a large blue apron over her pretty white graduating gown and then proceeded to manipulate the machine, the soap, the water, and the garment with precision, meanwhile explaining the facts that are involved in scientific cleaning. Later she displayed the fabric with the faultless results of her method; her concluding words were about the sanitary aspects of cleanliness, its place in community ideals and service, and its cultural value. Could anything more aptly and conclusively indicate the changing conceptions of education for women than such a number of graduation programme? The attitude of the graduate herself towards the work is a marvel of change in contrast to the essentially feminine essays of twenty-five years ago on "The Pleasures of Memory," while the fact that school authorities should consent to the presentation of such a theme indicates a new attitude in pedagogy and a clear comprehension of the service of science to human welfare. Of course the fine value in the incident was its revelation of the dignity inherent in doing well whatever ought to be done, and also the emphasis upon the thought that "no individual can be regarded as successful unless he can serve himself, in some degree at least."—Breeders' Gazette.
