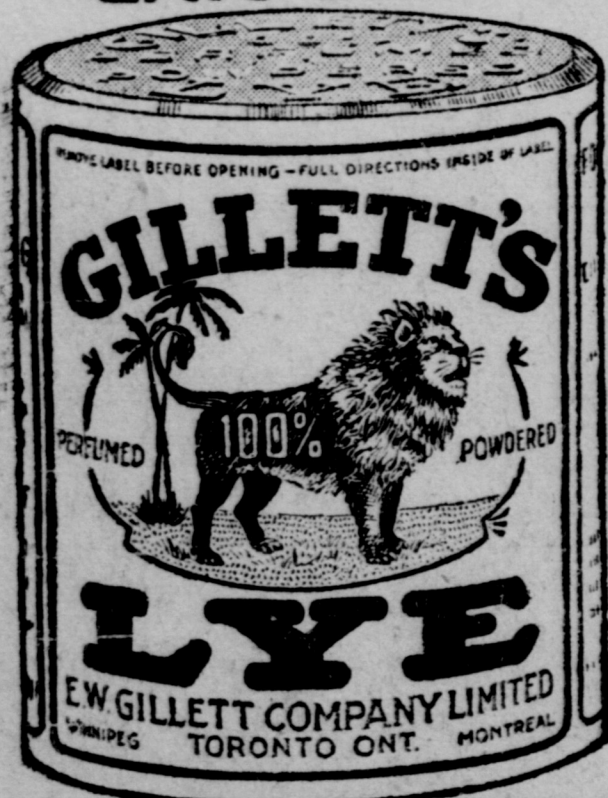

PRACTICALLY HELPFUL

Pythianism exists however not for self but for service. Pythianism for the Pythians is not our motto. Our principles of Friendship, Charity and Benevolence we try to make more than sentiments upon paper or feelings whose sole expression is emotional. I read a story in one of our Canadian newspapers the other day of a Hebrew clothes merchant to whom a tramp appealed for charity. This poor fellow was deserving and he unfolded a tale of real need and suffering. The son of Isaac was visibly impressed, his eyes indeed were full of tears. He called back into the rear room of his shop, 'Key, Ikey,' come and throw this man out, he's breaking my heart.' It is not in this relation that our order has stood to the appeal of human need and suffering. Year by year it has been able to accomplish a practical ministry of relief. Over a million and a half of dollars expended in this way is the Order's record for 1912. I was a little perplexed when first of all I reflected upon the order in which our principles of Friendship, Charity and Benevolence always appear in our motto. Why not Friendship, Benevolence and Charity. Benevolence means good-will. Should not good-will go before charity. Then I saw there was wisdom in that order. Pythians like the church which I represent were expected to tramp under foot that enthusiastic doctrine that they were not to no good unless their hearts were free to it! They were to be reminded that the way to foster interest and goodwill toward the needy was to keep up the habit of making practical sacrifices on their behalf.

WHY THIS SECRECY.

Some people look askance at fraternal societies because of the secrecy which seems to be one of the features which they have in common. Intimations of mysterious rites and cryptic mutterings which go on behind those locked doors and drawn blinds have come to them from some source—where, not one of them could tell. Well, as far as the Knights of Pythias is concerned there are some things we make no secret of. We make no secret of the principles for which we exist as an order. We make no secret of the kind of qualifications upon which we insist in the case of the man who would enter the lists of Pythianism. He must be of good moral character, a believer in God and an upholder of the constituted authority of Government. He must not be a professional gambler, saloon keeper,

THE ALCHEMY OF VIRTUES
In closing may I be permitted to address a word to my fellow knights of Ivanhoe Lodge. I would call your attention to a feature of the story of Damon and Pythias which is seldom emphasized but which shows the working of an exceedingly important moral law. I refer to the record there of the effect which the trust and love of the two friends had upon the selfish and inhuman tyrant Dionysius. It transformed his spirit. This is always the characteristic effect upon evil in others of their perception of a genuine and exalted virtue, unless indeed their souls are already lost. This is the law of all the saving power

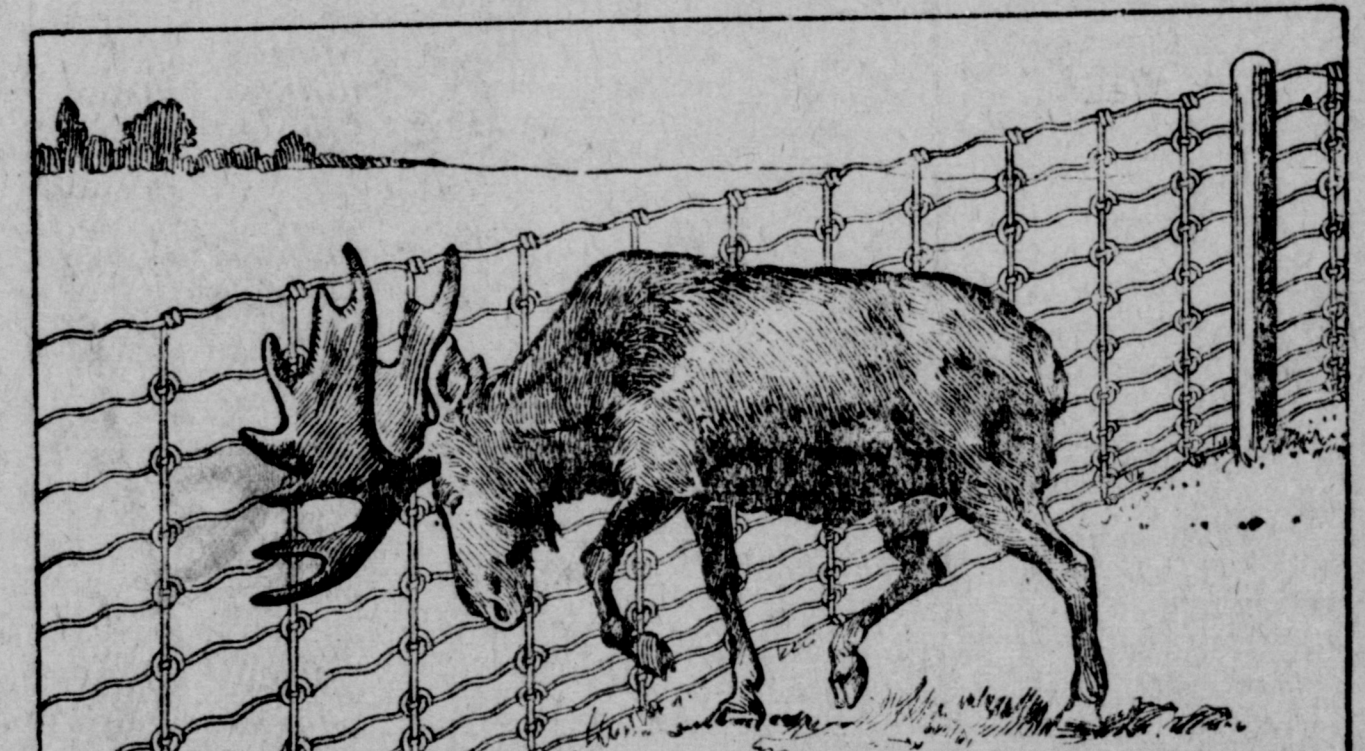

SUBJECTS OF STUDY

1st Week:

HORTICULTURE—Orchard sites and soils; varieties and nursery stock; planting, cultivation and cover crops; spraying, pruning and grafting; packing and judging; insects and diseases. Also small fruits and vegetables.

BEE-KEEPING—Life of the bee; care and management of the colony; honey production and marketing.

2nd Week:

FIELD CROPS—Judging and production of grains, grasses, clovers and alfalfa, potatoes, roots and corn.

SOIL MANAGEMENT—Cultivation; drainage; fertilizers; crop rotations; control of weeds.

3rd Week:

LIVE STOCK—Breeding, feeding, management and judging of horses, cattle, sheep and swine.

DAIRYING—Milk production; cream separators; Babcock testing; butter-making.

POULTRY—Egg production; housing; incubation and rearing; judging; marketing.

Outside men of high standing will assist the men of the Department of Agriculture.

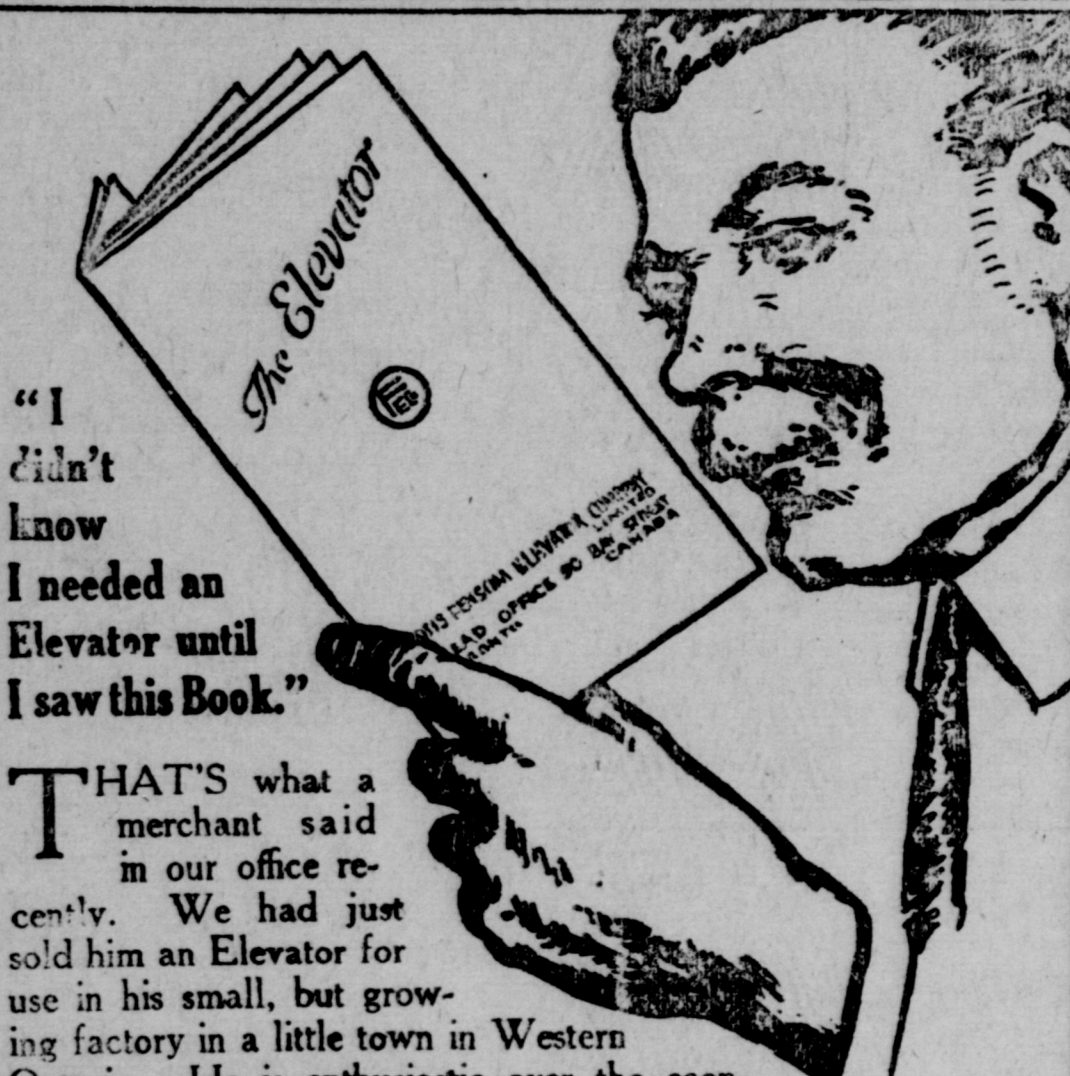
