This war is doing an enormous amount towards encouraging tea drinking all over the world, and it looks as though in countries where tea has up to now been more or less an experiment or a luxury it will in the near future be in a fair way of becoming a national beverage. Once attract a taste for tea and it will come to stay. The Russians have of course always been large tea drinkers, and with the Government's action in closing down the State-run vodka cabarets an even larger consumption is bound to follow. France, hitherto a very small consumer and essentially a coffee country, has been adopting tea to fight upon, and every French soldier who returns from the field will take the taste back to his family. It will all spell extra consumption and a continued range of high prices. Consumption has in the last year or two increased in a far greater ratio than has production, and fresh planting owing to various causes, chiefly the labour difficulty, has been handicapped. New land takes some years to come into full bearing, and young gardens require to be treated tenderly at first. Of course China could, if she would, produce countless millions, but unless British grown tea goes to absolutely prohibitive prices there is not much prospect of the tea-drinking public reverting to China Tea.

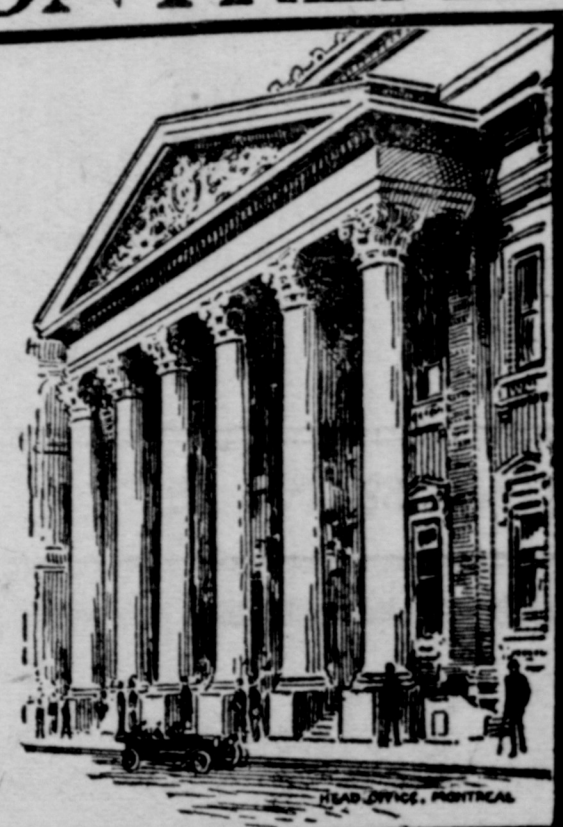
