TWENTY YEARS AGO

December 28th, 1895

Mr. Cavalier London, one of the earliest settlers of Bloomfield, and a man held in the highest esteem, died suddenly at his residence on the 17th inst, aged 74 years. The cause of death was paralysis of the heart. Mr. London leaves a widow and six sons. Three daughters died previously.
