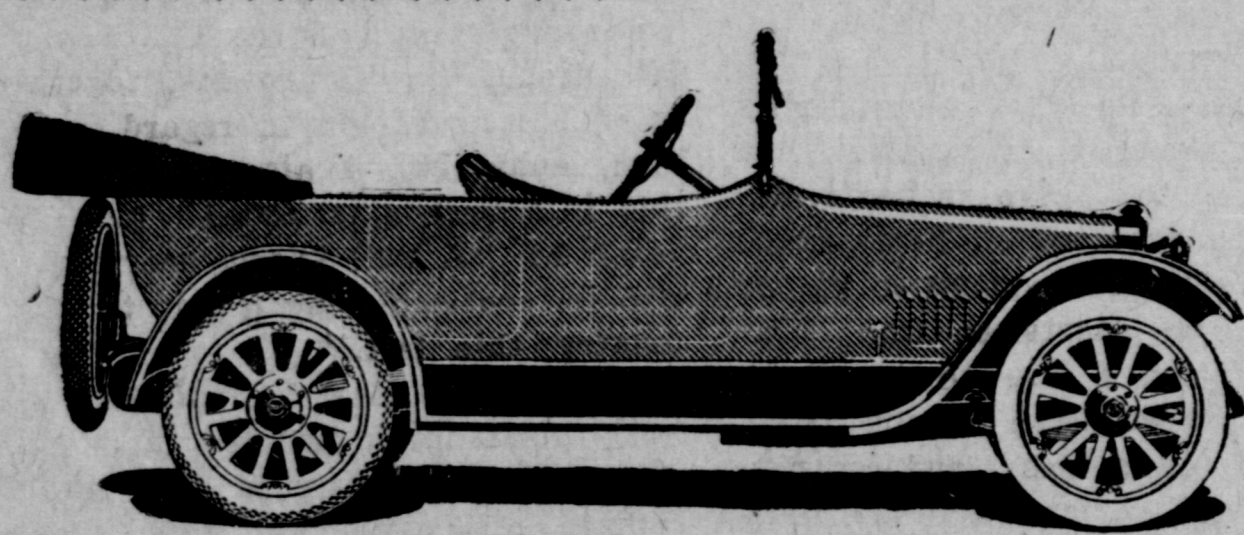

As our mail goes every Wednesday Friday and Saturday, I thought I would get a letter off to you on Saturday. I have just had dinner of roast, with cabbage and peas. We eat in our huts and a man is appointed every day to get the meals wash the dishes and clean up the hut. Tonight I am on picket in some town. We go through the streets and keep order. The roads are a kind of a pavement both in countries and towns. It must be great to tour this country in an auto. There is not very many horses—all motor trucks and auto trucks.
