WHAT HAS HAPPENED

A Concise Outline of the Trend of Events That Have Transpired in the War Zone

Another German spy faced a firing of the war to Britain is \$17,000,000 in the Tower of London last week.

Thirty-eight people were killed and 124 injured by German aerial raids over England last week.

Women employed in the making of munitions in England are to be paid at the same rate as men where the work done is equal.

A new Russian call to the colors will make possible an addition of the pick of 8,000,000 men to the Russian armies.

A British aviator last week dropped six bombs on a German cotton factory, and 40 Germans are believed to have been killed.

Plans are under way looking to the sending of ex-Secretary of State Bryan on a mission of peace to the belligerent nations.

The loan which the British and French Governments are seeking to float in the United States will bear interest at 5 per cent.

Lloyd-George in a speech last week plainly stated that if men enough cannot be had without conscription then conscription will come.

The Austrian Government has assented to the demand of the United States for the recall of Dr. Dumoi, the Austrian Ambassador at Washington.

An Australian aviator, while 5,000 feet in the air, hung with one hand to the wires of his aeroplane while fixing part of the wire supports that had become entangled and refused to work.

The total British appropriations for the war to date aggregate \$6,310,000,000. The average daily cost

800, or over three times the annual expenditure of the Ontario Government for all purposes ten years ago.

Fourteen stokers employed on the steamer Barranca have been sentenced to 28 days' imprisonment each for munitions in England are to be paid at the same rate as men where the work done is equal.

The French Parliament has enacted a law prohibiting all aliens from owning real estate near the frontier or any fortified place, and prohibiting the possession by anybody of German or Austrian origin of any realty whatever in French territory.

The Executive Committee of the British Amalgamated Union of Railway Servants has unanimously endorsed the statement in the House of Commons of J. H. Thomas that conscription would bring on an industrial revolution and that the railway workers would stop work.

The German Ambassador at Washington asks if those Americans who talk of breaking off diplomatic relations with Germany realize what such a step would mean. "If," he says, "diplomatic relations are broken off, the German submarine commanders will be instructed to sink everything they see, and of course this means war within two or three days."

Orders are being placed in Canada for \$17,000,000 worth of artillery and \$3,000,000 in shells for the British army. Besides this, orders are being placed for \$52,000,000 worth of shells and \$1,225,000 worth of locomotives for Russia.
