So it was until the 25th round, when Willard got one of his wildly swung windmill right hand smashes to Johnson's heart. This was the beginning of the end. When the round closed, Johnson sent word to his wife that he was all in, and told her to start for home. She was on the way out, and was passing the ring in the 26th round, when a stinging leit to the body and a cyclonic right to the jaw caused Johnson to crumple on the floor of the ropes, until the referee counted ten and held up Willard's hand in token of his newly won laurels.

There is much discussion tonight, and probably will be for all time, game as to whether Johnson was really knocked out. In the sense of being smashed into unconsciousness, he certainly was not put out. The concensus of opinion is that Johnson expected and knew that there was not possibility of his winning; so when knocked down, he chose to take the count rather than rise and
