The So-Called "War Tax" Stamp

A "war tax" of one cent has been imposed on each letter and postcard mailed in Canada for delivery in Canada, the United States or Mexico, and on each letter mailed in Canada for delivery in the United Kingdom and British Possessions generally, and wherever the two cent rate applies, to become effective on and from the 15th April, 1915.

This "War Tax" is to be prepaid by the senders by means of a War Stamp for sale by Postmasters and other postage stamp vendors. Wherever possible, stamps on which the word "War Tax" have been printed should be used for prepayment of "War Tax" but should ordinary postage stamps be used for this purpose, they will be accepted.

This War Stamp or additional Stamp for war purposes should be affixed to the upper right hand portion of the address side of the envelope or post card, close to the regular postage so that it may be readily cancelled at the same time as the postage.

In the event of failure on the part of the sender through oversight or negligence to prepay the "War Tax" on each letter or postcard above specified, such a letter or postcard will be sent immediately to the nearest Branch Dead Letter Office.

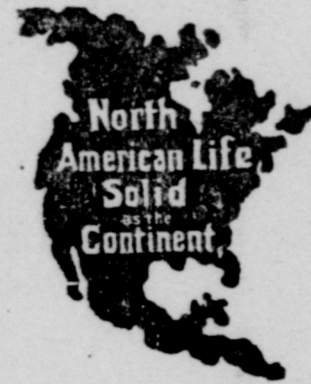
It is essential that postage on all classes of mail matter should be prepaid by means of ordinary postage stamps. The "War Tax" stamp will not be accepted in any case for the prepayment of postage.

SOME COOKING HINTS

OATMEAL GEMS—Take one cupful of cooked oatmeal, one cupful of sweet milk, two teaspoonfuls of sugar, one beaten egg, one-half teaspoonful of salt, one-half teaspoonful of soda, and one teaspoonful of cream of tartar (or one heaping teaspoonful of baking powder instead of the soda and the cream of tartar), and just enough flour to hold the mixture together. Bake the dough in hot gem pans in a quick oven.

CURRAET MUFFINS—One cup milk, 3 cups of flour, 2 tablespoons fat, 1 cup sugar, 1 teaspoon salt, 4 teaspoons baking powder, 1 egg, 1-3 cup currants. Mix and sift dry materials together. Add milk, then beaten egg and melted fat. Stir in currants, which have been washed and sprinkled with a little flour. Bake in a moderate oven about 20 minutes.
