David Gidney, Customs officer, has been quite poorly but is improving some. Dr. Griffin was in attendance.

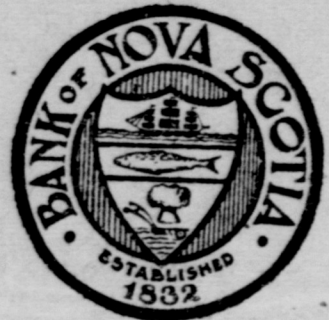
Mrs. J. H. McInerlin and daughter Mrs. Blair Graham visited friends in Maxwell the 12th inst.
