THE NEWCASTLE LEADER HANDS IT TO THE "APOSTLE OF CONSERVATIVES"

Ready to Boost B. F. Smith—Reap the Harvest Now, Chances Slim After Election

(New Castle Leader)

The Fredericton Gleaner edited by one J. H. Crockett who is known the province over as a purist and the apostle of the Conservatives of Fredericton, is, after remaining silent for the past three months saying nice things about the new minister of Public Works.

The following are some extracts taken from The Gleaner.

"The opinion of the people who use the roads and who know of their condition from experience is that, on the whole, the roads of this province are in pretty good shape, in much better condition than in Nova Scotia and in other of the neighboring provinces.

"There are, of course, some bad spots in some places. . . . The responsibility for this rests upon the representatives of the counties, who, while they may not have been able to get their representations accepted and acted upon by the Department of Public Works as controlled by the Hon. John Morrissey, recently required FOR VARIOUS REASONS to tender his resignation, should nevertheless have been more persistent in their efforts to promote and further the public interests in this service.

"The Government are moving prudently and intelligently in the matter, and their activity since the decapitation of Mr. Morrissey is commendable!"

Poor Crockett! Does he expect the new minister to endorse for him? or maybe he expects to get a credit note on the bank for next year's printing. Perhaps he is under the impression that it will be very easy for him to get \$1,000 or so and probably get the Board of Works department to take it out in stock (like a Valley Railway contractor) in The Gleaner. He gives the government credit for good roads and Morrissey credit for the bad spots. For this Crockett is to be commended. We always thought him too narrow to even give Morrissey credit for the holes.

He further says "Morrissey was recently required for various reasons to tender his resignation." What are THE VARIOUS REASONS? Premier Clark in asking Morrissey to resign said "that there was nothing to reflect on him." In other words, Morrissey was honest and this was why he was asked for his resignation. This being so, the inference drawn by the intelligent electors, is "that honest men were not wanted in the Clark government. There may be another reason besides this, but Jimmy Crockett is too cowardly to state it. He has no use for Morrissey; he has no use for Mahoney, but he is ready to boost B. F. Smith, the spud purchaser of Carleton. Why?

Crockett imagines he has the brains of the Conservative party at Fredericton, and he wants no minister in the government to whom he cannot dictate. Of course every one knows that Jimmy is a saint, he would not do a wrong to any man, and he never was known to graft or tell a lie in his life.

"Go to it," Jimmy, your term is getting short. If you don't reap the harvest now your chances will be slim after the next election.






