A Hammerhead's Nest Has Three Rooms, All Big and Strong.

No single room apartment satisfies the hammerhead. When he builds his nest he divides it into three rooms—a reception hall, a drawing room and a bedroom.

The entire structure is built of sticks, dome shape, and sometimes six feet in diameter. The bird is so good a carpenter and engineer that the nest will bear the weight of a man.

In appearance the bird looks always as if he needed a haircut. His long locks, hanging down his neck, have given him his name, hammerhead.

The entrance to this domelike nest is

small and on the concealed side. The first room is the hall, where the hammerhead lives when he fears attack. Behind this is the drawing room, the home of the young birds when they outgrow the bedroom.

The bedroom is higher than the rest and safe from floods. Here the female bird deposits eggs on a nest of leaves, and both parents take turns at keeping them warm.

The hammerhead lives in Africa, usually builds his nest near a stream and eats fish, frogs, lizards and small snakes.

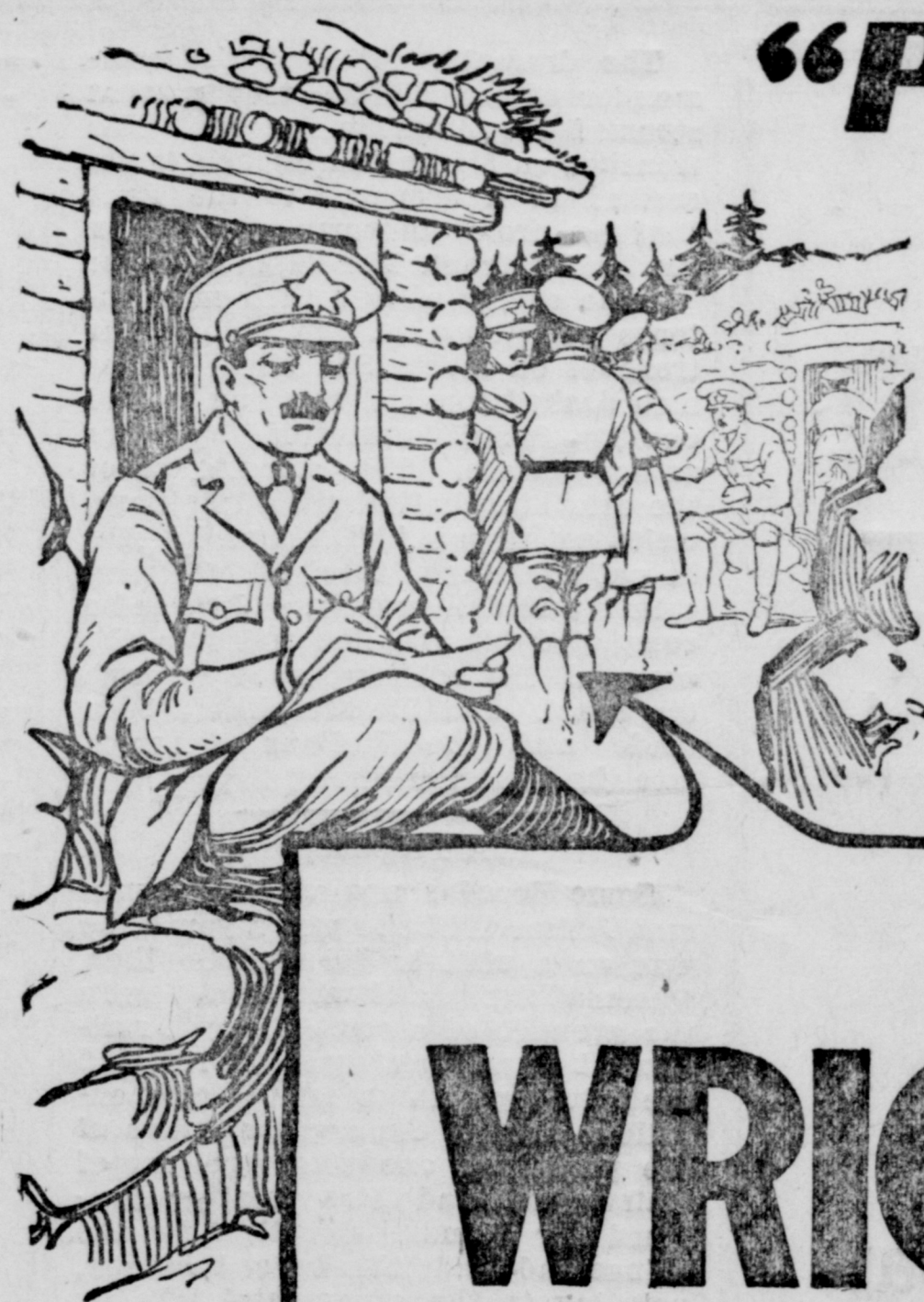

Damp Weather Abroad.

Next to the war the abnormal weather
which has harassed England so
far this year is the most-talked-of
thing in the country, says a despatch
from London. A sunny day so far
this season is an event. The same
holds true of all northern Europe,
where weather of the kind ressem-
bling March has prevailed through-
out June and July. In Russia there
has been an unusual amount of rain
and excessive cold. In Moscow up to
the middle of July, there had been
no sign of summer or of the hot
weather which generally sets in be-
fore June. In Scandinavia the weather
has been cheerless and very sim-
ilar to that in England. In southern
Germany violent rains have fallen
and Lake Constance is abnormally
high, while in Austria there have
been tremendous storms. South of
the Alps excessively hot weather has
been reported for many weeks. In
Sardinia there has been a heat wave
which has been followed by forest
fires.

Public Notice is hereby given that under
the First Part of chapter 70 of the Re-
vised Statutes of Canada, 1906, known as
"The Companies Act," letters patent have
been issued under the Seal of the Secre-
tary of State of Canada, bearing date the
7th day of September, 1916, incorporat-
ing Heber Harold Hatfield, of the Village
of Hartland, in the Province of New
Brunswick, produce dealer; Guy Glad-
stone Porter, of the Village of Perth, in
the said Province, produce dealer;
Andrew Davis McCain, of the Village of
Florenceville, in the said Province, pro-
duce dealer; Charles Wilmot Clark and
Orison Richard Estey, both of the Town
of Woodstock, in the said Province, pro-
duce dealers; Benjamin Franklin Smith, of
the Village of East Florenceville, in the
said Province, produce dealer; and
Charles Francis Gallagher and John
Walter Bohan, both of the Village of
Bath, in the said Province, produce de-
alers, for the following purposes, viz:—

(a) To carry on the business of a gen-
eral merchant, both wholesale and retail,
in potatoes and other agricultural prod-
ucts;

(b) To act as a commission merchant,
broker, agent, factor or in any other rep-
resentative capacity for companies, firms
or corporations carrying on business in
whole or in part similar to that of the
company;

(c) To promote legislation to en-
courage agricultural production, provide
for shipping facilities, and for any pur-
pose which may be deemed of advantage
to the company's business, and to apply to
the Board of Railway Commissioners in
respect of freight rates, shipping facilities
or any other matter which may seem de-
sirable to the company;

(d) To engage in any other business
which the company may consider ad-
visable in connection with the foregoing
powers or otherwise;

(e) To sell and dispose of the under-
taking of the company for cash or shares,
debentures or securities of any company;

(f) To pay the costs and expenses of
the incorporation and organization of the
company.

The operations of the company to be
