WHAT HAS HAPPENED

Concise Outline of the Trend of Events That Have Transpired in the War Zone

The Prince of Wales has gone to Egypt to join the troops there. The Italian Chamber, by a vote of 394 to 51, has approved Italy's war policy. Jasper Kruger, nephew of the late President Kruger, has joined the South African contingent and is now training in England.

Three British airmen, Lieuts Johnstone, Beaumont and Laidlaw, were killed in one day in accidents while on experimental flights.

German authorities estimate French losses up to March 1st at 2,500,000, of whom 800,000 have been killed. From the same source it is stated that British losses total 600,000.

British armed motor cars attacked and broke up a hostile camp near the Egypt-Tripoli border, and 91 prisoners, part of them crews of shipwrecked vessels, were rescued.

Two thousand panes of glass were shattered, and serious damage resulted to houses and shops, when a mine drifted ashore on the Danish coast exploded.

The London Times, in describing the fighting before Verdun, says: "The sort of thing that has been going on for days is neither magnificent nor war. It is just scientific slaughter."

The election of directors of Manchester Chamber of Commerce resulted in the return of eighteen out of twenty-two directors, who are definitely committed to the policy of no free trade with Germany after the war.

The British Government is going to prohibit the importation of musical instruments, automobiles, hardware and a lot of other articles in order to relieve the carrying companies for what is considered more important work.

A French artillery officer says that

once, during the later stages of the Verdun fighting, as a German mass came up where thousands of German corpses were lying, the mass broke and fled. The men knew a like fate awaited them if they advanced and no coercion or persuasion could force them to continue the advance.

"FOOL LEGISLATION"

(Chatham World.)

Attorney-General Baxter's bill in reference to revolvers of votes is worthy of being placed in a collection of statutory curiosities. It is almost inconceivably freakish. He takes from the county councillors their present status as revisors and provides that such officers are to be appointed in future by members of the legislature and defeated candidates for the districts which they represent. How will this work out in practice? Who will fix the boundaries of the district for which the members and defeated candidates will act? How, for instance, will the thirteen parishes of Northumberland be divided among the several candidates who ran in the last election? Who would make the division and fix the boundaries of individual individuals? Would not the result be in practice the selection of revisors for the whole county by one man, just as revisors, game warden and justices of the peace are at present appointed? more absurd in the way of a statutory change we would like to hear from them. The remuneration for revising votes belongs at present to municipal councillors and it partially pays them for their services to the parish. Under the proposed change, the payment would be given to party hacks in payment of their services to elected and defeated candidates. Would this be in the public interest? The present revisors are men who have been endorsed by a majority of the electors and they may be fairly presumed to have necessary qualifications for the work. Most of the men to be appointed under Mr. Baxter's bill may have no qualifications, but may be appointed simply as a means of giving them a few dollars each for election services. The provincial hospital for nervous diseases is situated in Mr. Baxter's district and this bill must have originated within the wall of that institution, as anything so freakish, impracticable and foolish could not have been conceived anywhere except in a lunatic asylum. It is fool legislation.

SOME COOKING HINTS

DOUGHNUTS—Here is a recipe for doughnuts, which I think, is fine. Have never had a failure since I started using it, and have used it for five years at least—One cup sugar, one cup milk, two tablespoon cream, two eggs beaten very light, pinch of salt, one teaspoon ground nutmeg, two rounding teaspoons baking powder. Add enough flour to make a very soft dough; about three cups. Roll out, cut and fry in reasonably hot fat. Roll in powdered sugar or not, as you please. They will be fine if you do not get the dough too stiff, as many do.

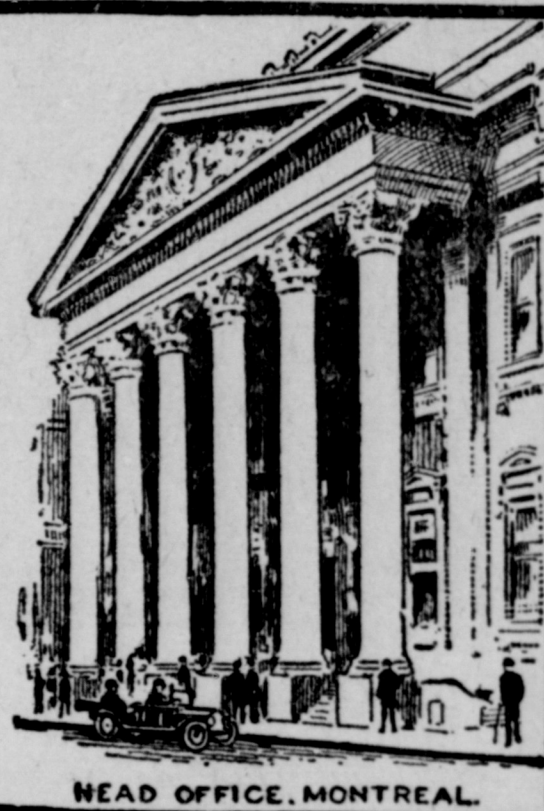

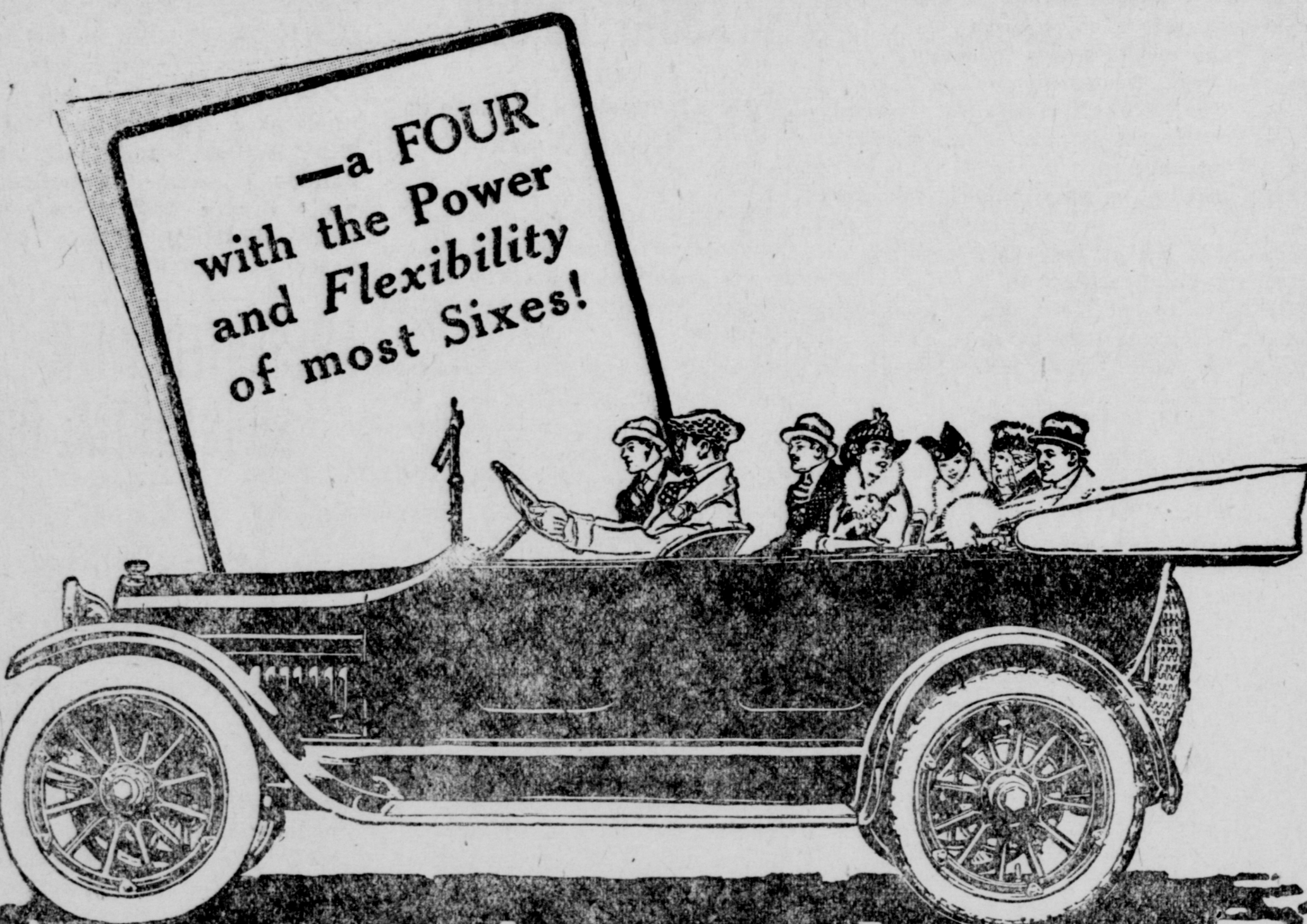
