Notice is hereby given that under and by virtue of a Power of Sale contained in a certain Indenture of Mortgage, bearing date, the first day of October, in the year of our Lord, One thousand, Nine hundred and Ten, and made between Isaac N. Draper, of the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton, and Province of New Brunswick, chool teacher, and Josiah Hallett, of the Parish of Southampton, in the County of York, Province aforesaid, Lumberman, and registered in the office of the Registrar of Deeds for the County of Carleton, in Book V, Number 4, of Records, on pages 726, 727, 728 and 729, there will, for the purpose of satisfying the money secured by the said Indenture of Mortgage, default having been made in payment of the same, be sold at Public Auction, in front of the Post Office, in the Town of Woodstock, in the said County of Carleton, on Monday, the Eighteenth day of December next, at the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon, the lands and premises described in the said Indenture of Mortgage, as follows:—All that certain piece or parcel of land situate in Upper Woodstock or Upper Corner in said Parish of Woodstock, and particularly bounded and described as follows:—commencing at a point on the main highway road at a point thirty feet south from the southern line of a lot of land owned by John Harper (said point of commencement, being at the south easterly corner of a part of the yellow house lot heretofore leased by one R. B. Ketchum to one William C. 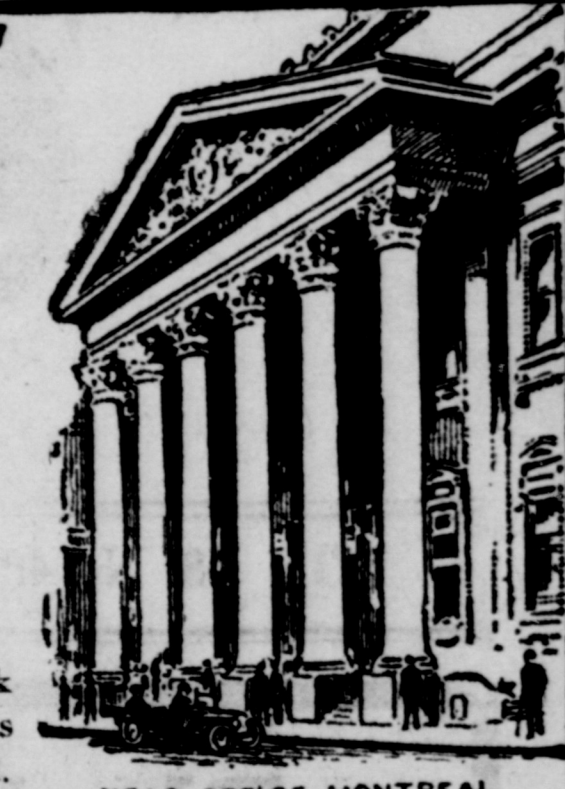

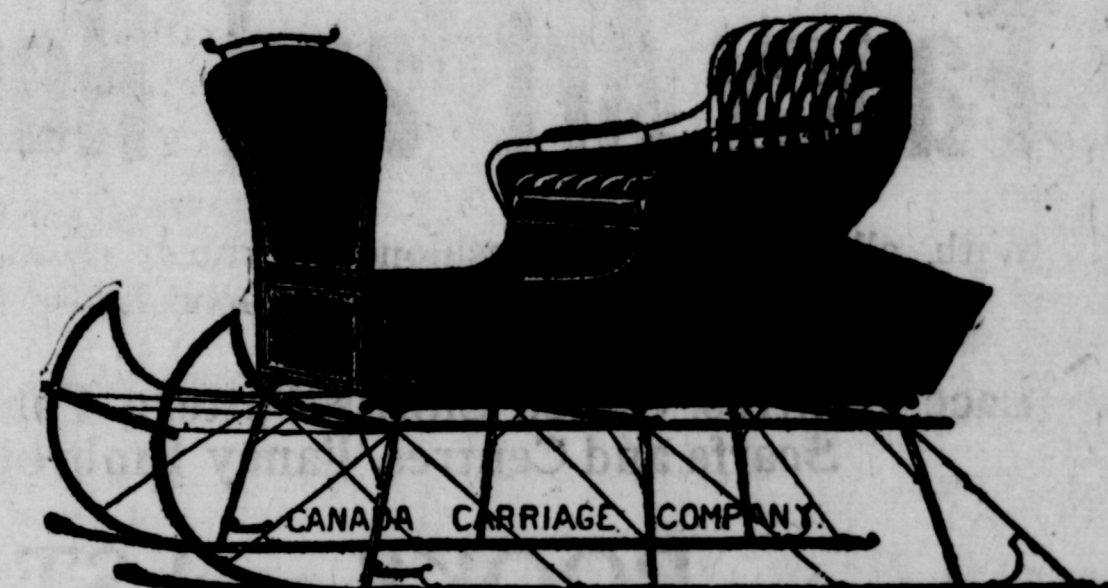
