## THE AMERICAN LEGION

Lt. M. B. Alexander, a former Woodstock boy, formerly of Houlton, Me., has established headquarters at the armoury here to recruit for the American Legion. Lt. Alexander was born in this town. He is a son of W. E. Alexander, Supt. of Bridges and Construction of the B. & A. R. R., who went over to the other side at the time the road was being constructed. When the war broke out Lt. Alexander was in the employ of Powers & Brewer of St. John. With many other former Canadians he hastened to join the new American Legion, as it is called.

The Legion will be a full brigade of four infantry battalions. One unit the 97th Batt., is already recruited to full strength and leaving immediately for the front. Four more units are being recruited in different parts of Canada from Vancouver to the Maritime Provinces. These are the 211th, 212th, 213th and 237th, the last named being the unit for the Maritime Provinces. These will mobilize and go across, not as separate battalions, but as a single brigade, so that men joining this corps can be sure of remaining with the Legion, and not being transferred, as has happened in the case of several of the Canadian units.

Who the brigade commander will be is not yet known, but rumor has it that some prominent American will take command. The officers so far chosen are a fine lot and they hope to make the Legion the finest corps that Canada has sent overseas to support the cause of the Allies and Civilization. It is not expected, judging by results so far,

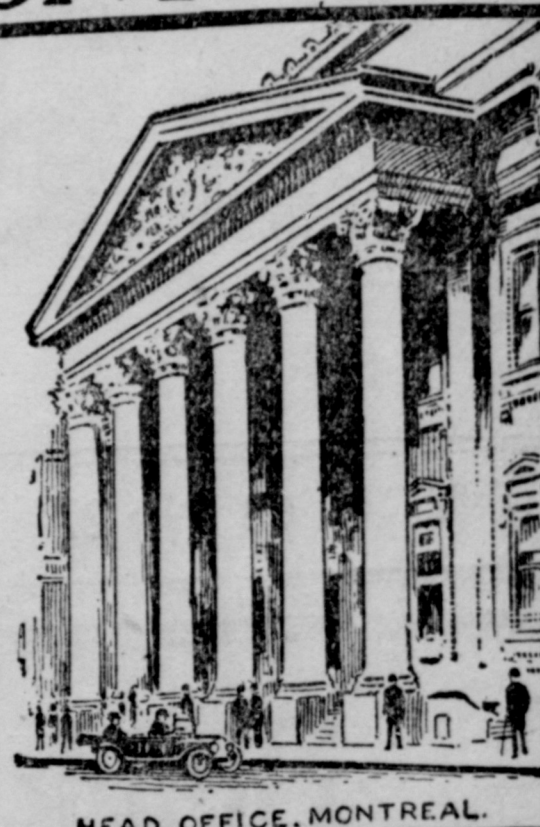
