## PROHIBITION BILL

to be a private dwelling house within the meaning of this act during the time the person so convicted occupied the said house or any part thereof.

49. Section 8 shall not apply to any person who within a private dwelling house innocently consumes liquor not purchased and received from a licensee.

Those who may be licensed include druggists, wholesale and retail, who are authorized as such by the New Brunswick Pharmaceutical Society. The wholesale druggist is allowed to

sell, subject to certain provisions, alcohol not exceeding five gallons at any one time to any person for medicinal or scientific purposes, or to sell to duly registered medical practitioners, but to no one else, liquor not exceeding two quarts at any one time. The wholesale druggist may sell to a retail druggist liquor not exceeding five gallons at one time and to incorporated public hospitals liquor not exceeding two gallons at any one time.

A licensed retail druggist (druggists must have both a druggist's license and a liquor license if they are to sell liquor) shall be authorized to sell liquor for medicinal and sacramental purposes only. Separate premises require separate licenses.

All persons applying for licenses have to file an application in the department of the provincial secretary at Fredericton, or with the chief inspector, and must be of good reputation and character, and able to show that he has not been convicted of any offence against the provisions of this act or any previous liquor act within three years prior to his application. All applicants for licenses must provide a bond to be approved by the chief inspector. The bond to be of \$500 for the applicant or principal and \$250 each for the sureties.

Objection to licenses, wholesale or retail, may be filed by ten or more ratepayers living in the vicinity and the chief inspector shall pass upon their objections.

Druggists must keep an accurate record of all sales in a book kept for that purpose showing every sale or delivery of liquor, the date, the name and address of the buyer, the quantity sold, etc., and this book shall always be open to inspection by the chief inspector or his deputies.

Retail druggists must keep copies of all prescriptions they have filled for liquor, and only one sale shall be made on one prescription. No prescription shall be for more than six ounces. Ten days after the expiration of each month the druggist shall forward to the chief inspector a complete record of the certificates and prescriptions in order to show whether or not the regulations have been violated or abused.

ENFORCEMENT. The lieutenant-governor in council appoints a chief inspector, who in turn appoints local inspectors, one for each county, town and city, and

if necessary additional inspectors shall be appointed for sub-divisions. The salary of the chief inspector is fixed by the local government. The other expenses are to be paid by the cities, towns or counties in question.

Any one who gives credit for liquor has no remedy at law.

While the duty of enforcing the act falls upon the inspectors, any person can lay information or prosecute in connection with an offence under the act. The municipalities have to bear the necessary expenses for enforcement within their limits. Some additional information with respect to enforcements, penalties etc., follow here:

The chief inspector in addition to the duties specially given him shall make an inspection of all premises where liquor is lawfully kept for sale and inspect the books and accounts of every local inspector to ascertain if he is properly performing his duty.

ing his duty. Local inspectors shall act under the direction of the chief inspector and see that all the provisions of the act are enforced. For every default in the discharge of his duty an inspector shall be liable to a penalty of \$50, which may be recovered by any person suing for the same, but one half of the penalty recovered shall be paid to the treasurer of the municipality for which such inspector has been appointed.

Every person having been three times convicted of violation of the act shall be considered "A persistent violator", and upon subsequent conviction shall be imprisoned with hard labor for one year. Any person who having violated the provisions of the act attempts to compound or settle the offence, and any person concerned in or in connection with any such attempt, shall be liable to imprisonment with hard labor for three months. Any person tampering with a witness, or attempting to bribe or use threats to one, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$50 nor more than \$300 for each offence.

No licensee shall accept in payment for liquor sold by him anything except current money or the purchaser's own check under a penalty of \$20, or a month's imprisonment, and no licensee shall receive payment in advance for liquor or agree to be sold. No liquor shall be sold on credit, and if any is so sold, the price therefor shall not be recoverable in any court; this, however, does not apply to sales made under a wholesale license.

PENALTIES. All penalties or fines in money recovered under the act shall be immediately paid to the convicting magistrate, and by him at once turned over to the treasurer of the city, town or municipality which bears the expenses of administering the act; and no judge, magistrate, inspector or other person shall have any power of authority to remit, suspend or compromise any penalty or punishment inflicted under the act. In the event of the imprisonment of any person upon several warrants of commitment under different sections, the terms of imprisonment under such warrants shall be consecutive and not concurrent.

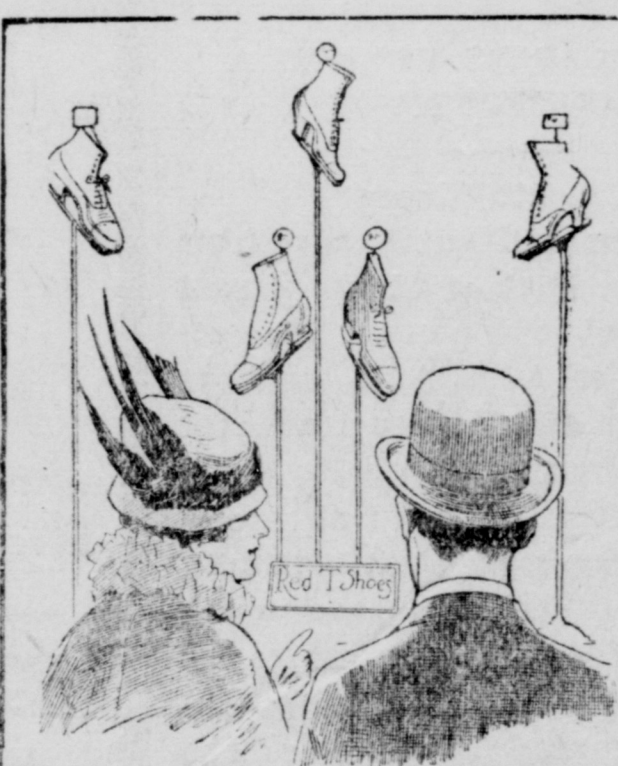
PROSECUTIONS. The provisions of the act for the prosecution of offences are largely on the same lines as those under the Canada Temperance Act and the Liquor License Act. No action shall be taken against any inspector or other person employed in carrying out the provisions of the act except on one month's notice being given to him stating clearly the cause of action and the name of the party intending to bring same and the place of proposed trial and no evidence shall be produced on the hearing of anything of which notice has not been given and no judgment shall be given to the plaintiff unless delivery of such notice is proved.

It shall be the duty of every policeman, constable or inspector who sees any person apparently under the influence of liquor in any public place or public conveyance or at

any fair, tea-party, picnic or society gathering to take such person before a magistrate or town clerk or person authorized to administer oath and make such person disclose on oath whether he had drunk any liquor on that day and if so, the nature and quantity of it and when, where and from whom obtained and whether purchased or not. If such person refuses to give such information he may be imprisoned until he does so, but such imprisonment shall not continue for longer than twenty-four hours from the time of his arrest.

APPEALS. Except in the case of a licensee there shall be no appeal from a conviction or order of a magistrate or justice of the peace, but a convicted licensee may on entering into a bond with sufficient sureties in the sum of \$200 each may appeal to a judge of the supreme court in chambers.

## BILLY SUNDAY ON BOOZE

When Billy Sunday spoke in Toronto he said in part—

"Newspapers have turned the searchlight on the dark, dirty dungeons and cleansed them out to make the cities pure. Liquor is the crime of crimes, the sin of sins. It is the source of three-fourths of all the crime and it takes three-fourths of your taxation to care for the lobster after you have landed him."

"Who foots the bill for all this?"

The landlord who loses the rent, the baker, the butcher, grocer, coal merchant, the dry goods merchant and the charitable men who pity the children of the poor drunkard, who keep them from starving, who go deep down into their pockets to support them, and the tax payers who maintain the jails, penitentiaries and poor houses. For every eight hundred dollars spent in producing useful and necessary commodities the working man received \$154.3 in wages. But for every eight hundred dollars spent the manufacture of booze the working man gets only \$9.84.

"The saloon comes as near being the rat-hole into which the working man can dump his wages as anything this side of hell."

"In my opinion the man who stands and champions the saloon deserves to have his boy die a drunkard. If you don't want him to die a drunkard why do you force the saloon on him? The man who does not believe in hell has never seen a drunkard's home."

"Lincoln said that if slavery was not a crime he did not know what was. If the death, if the disease, if the pauperism, if the crime, if the insanity, if the immorality in all its hideous forms, which results from the license system, does not make it a crime, I don't know what will."

"The liquor interests are powerfully entrenched in the land. You must put up your signs against the

impurity breeds. Outraged humanity will never get the better of it until it is hung on the gibbet of public shame. Now is the time for people to put up their hands for action independent of governments."

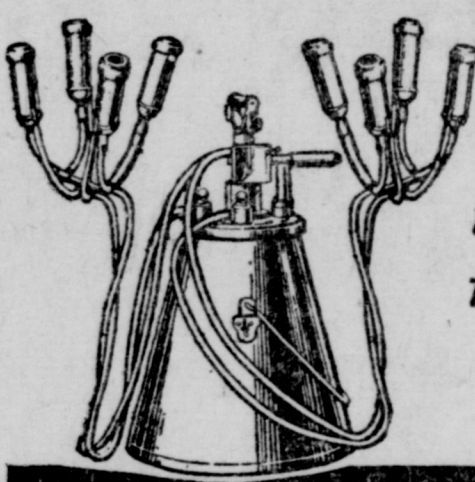
