PROSECUTIONS.

The provisions of the act for the prosecution of offences are largely on the same lines as those under the Canada Temperance Act and the Liquor License Act. No action shall be taken against any inspector on other person employed in carrying, out the provisions of the act except on one month's notice being given to him stating clearly the cause of action and the name of the party intending to bring same and the place of proposed trial and no evidence shall be produced on the hearing of anything of which notice has not been given and no judgment shall be given to the plaintiff unless delivery of such notice is proved.
