





A Comrade's Tribute to the Late Jamie Ketchum-Circumstances Surrounding His Death-Gave Up His Life in Performance of His Duty-Lies in a Newly Made Grave in a Little Town in France.

I suppose that by the time this reaches you, youwill have heard of the death of your son due to wounds received in action

our signalling staff and held one of the really important positions in the battery. It was while attempt was being made to repair our telephone lines that he was wounded. As I was once a signaller I have a rather fatherly interest in all signallers even though I am only twenty one and our signallers were my special care.

Your son was hit in the neck and chest and was taken to the dressing station about half a mile away. From there he was sent to a hospital down the line a few miles, but the shock of the wounds proved too much and he died the next day.

He was buried as befits a true soldier with many of the bravest of our land.
