Since Mr. F.B. Carvell declared himself favorable to coalition he has received honorable mention in a story newspaper—not, of course, the St. John Standard. Mr. Carvell has some work to do in connection with New Brunswick affairs which the Standard does not relish.

Rev. A.S. Hazel and family narrowly escaped serious injury, Monday when an automobile driven by a reckless driver ran into the carriage in which they were seated and badly damaged the vehicle, the occupants fortunately escaping. The car was from Houlton and was held here pending an inquiry.

Charles Sullivan gave a demonstration of butter-making at Dents, Saturday. Those present were convinced that the "Home Butter Mergers" can do all that is claimed for it. This little machine, that makes butter for four cents a pound, is sold for six dollars, the cost of only a few pounds of butter.

Houlton Grange, on Saturday voted to build a flour mill with a capacity of 50 barrels daily. This means an expenditure of some \$12,000 to \$15,000, and insures the members of the world's largest grange that if they raise the wheat there will be no need to worry over the flour question—Pioneer.

A disturber of the peace when placed under arrest Saturday night violently resisted and attracted a large crowd. He was landed in the cooler and next morning was called upon to make a cash contribution to the town.

The valuation party of the Western Union Telegraph Co., which is engaged in making a detailed inventory of the company's property in Eastern Canada, is now at Woodstock. As this work involves a survey of the entire 2500 miles of telegraph lines, with listing and description of every feature, even to a report on the condition of poles in addition to a minute inventory of the contents of each office of the Company, the task will not be a small one. It is expected that the work will take until September.

Of the 2500 miles of telegraph lines to be inspected about half is along the railways and the other half is on the highways. The inspection along the railways will be made with the aid of motor cars and on the highways teams and automobiles will be used. Messrs L.A. Head and E.J. Tobins, Valuation Engineers from a New York City office, in charge of the railway and highway branches of the work respectively will maintain headquarters at the Carlisle Hotel here for some time, while their assistants continue the work of actual inspection.

The Shannon-Tapley feud is still on and one George Haley, an understudy of the Shannon warriors, was before the police magistrate Monday, charged with shooting at James Tapley and wife with intent to do grievous bodily harm. Haley was placed on a piece of land owned by Shannon, and also claimed by Tapley, and when the latter appeared on the land Haley, it is charged, opened fire. He was committed for trial on this charge. He was before the court again Tuesday for stealing wood off the land but was not convicted.

"HE LIVED AND DIED A TRUE SOLDIER"

A Comrade's Tribute to the Late Jamie Ketchum—Circumstances Surrounding His Death—Gave Up His Life in Performance of His Duty—Lies in a Newly Made Grave in a Little Town in France.

Mr. T. O. L. Ketchum has received the following letter concerning the death of his son, James O. Ketchum, at the front: May 10, 1917. France.

My dear Mr. Ketchum: I suppose that by the time this reaches you, you will have heard of the death of your son due to wounds received in action with the battery.

As you are aware your boy was one of our signalling staff and held one of the really important positions in the battery. It was while attempt was being made to repair our telephone lines that he was wounded. As I was once a signaller I have a rather fatherly interest in all signallers even though I am only twenty one and our signallers were my special care.

Your son was hit in the neck and chest and was taken to the dressing station about half a mile away. From there he was sent to a hospital down the line a few miles, but the shock of the wounds proved too much and he died the next day.

He was buried as befits a true soldier in the military plot at the little cross-road town or Aux Reitz, where he lies with many of the bravest of our land.

In the six months I have been with the battery, I never knew him to complain and he was always on the job when there was something ticklish to be done.

You may well be proud of him, for he lived and died a true soldier and a manly gentleman.

I sympathize with you very deeply, for losing one of my "boys" is almost like losing a brother.

The Battery is erecting a cross and will take care of the grave to the best of our ability.
